Time to Go

I am 65 in the summer and retire from full time stipendiary ministry on 23rd June this year. My last Sunday service at St Catherine's Crook will be on June 10th and the last Sunday service in the Team will be on June 17th at All Saints, Underbarrow. June and I have had a busy, nearly seven years working with the emerging Two Valleys Team of churches. We hope to move locally, possibly into Kendal or a nearby village, but that is not clear yet. So we won't be very far away and we may pop out of the woodwork at various times to surprise you.

The Two Valleys Team is looking to the future following the start of the new way of working seven years ago, when we arrived. The Diocese now has a new Bishop and a new Vision and Strategy for the next ten years. We are now thinking about drawing a Mission Action Plan for our group of parishes. It is an exciting and challenging time ahead. There is a projection that 25% of the currently serving clergy in the Church of England are retiring in the next ten years. Whilst I am in the vanguard of this movement into retirement I know it will create a challenge for our parish Churches in how to minister and worship with fewer ordained clergy available. In other words for a Church to flourish in the future lay Christians will have to take on many more roles in the leadership and organisation of our local churches.

As an ordained minister in the Church of England one becomes involved with people at important stages of their lives and it is a privilege to serve a community in such a unique position. I have seen many people come to faith and grow as Christians, which is very rewarding as a minister. June and I have been particularly involved with the Alpha course and we think we have run 18 of them over the years. We are both very grateful to all those people who have helped and supported us in this endeavour. We hope that the course will continue to be run and promoted in the Team.

I would ask you to please pray for June and I as we move. I will be praying for you, that the Holy Spirit will guide you as a parish, draw you together as a fellowship within the Two Valleys Team and lead you on to new and exciting possibilities with the Lord Jesus. Be open, be ready, be sure that Jesus is the way, the truth and the life.

SUNDAYS AT 11

After over 30 years of coming together to worship at 10am every Sunday, a period during which the church has grown steadily, we have decided to change the service time on Sundays to 11am, **beginning on May 6th**. Why? Rev Tim Harmer retires in June after seven years of ministry here. Half of his time has been spent serving the parishes of Underbarrow, Helsington and Crook, while the other half has been across the Kendal deanery. The Diocese has decided not to replace the half time post with the three parishes. Therefore other clergy and congregations have been asked to make changes so that regular worship, ministry and mission can continue in these villages.

St Catherine's is currently one of the best resourced village churches in the Diocese, led by our Vicar, Canon Tim Montgomery, other members of the St Thomas' clergy and readers, Rev Brian Crowe as curate, Reg Bradby as reader and Tony and Hilary Fitch training to become readers. However, the 10am service time reduces their flexibility to lead at more than one service on a Sunday morning, whether at St Thomas' or other Two Valleys villages. Consequently, St Catherine's was asked to consider altering their preferred service time. At the outset, this would enable Brian Crowe to fill the gap created by Tim's retirement to lead worship, ministry and mission not only at Crook but also at Underbarrow and Helsington. Maureen Stevens, a reader, would additionally be fully involved at Helsington. Their services of worship would both begin at 9.30am in future.

Some concern was expressed by members of the PCC during extensive discussion, but the conclusion was that we should do what we can to enable worship, ministry and mission to thrive in these other local communities of Underbarrow and Helsington within the Two Valleys Team. We remember that when St Catherine's was struggling some 30-odd years ago, it took the sacrifice of ministers and readers at St Thomas' to support us so that we are now in the well-resourced position we enjoy today. Now it is our turn to offer that same support to others. We will clearly review this decision, after allowing a period for adjustment, if there is significant cause for concern. However, we go forward with confidence that as God has blessed us in the past, so God will continue to do so as we step forward in faith.

We welcome all to join us each Sunday at 11am to gather together to worship God.

A Passion for Kendal

A new passion play written for the people of Kendal to be performed on 6th and 7th April 2012 on the streets of Kendal and leading up to the Castle



KENDAL is to have its own Passion Play this year. It will be like the medieval mystery plays that are still being performed after hundreds of years, and will take place over two days at Easter at several sites in the town centre on Friday, when the last day of Jesus' life will be enacted during the afternoon, and then on Castle Hill on Saturday when there will be choirs and fire sculptures to accompany scenes of the Resurrection.

Good Friday Afternoon:

The Passion Play starts in the middle of Kendal at the Library, with a plot to betray Jesus. The audience then moves to the Market Place for the Betrayal and Arrest.

The action moves through the Shambles, accompanied by street musicians and performers to the Birdcage - now a prison. From here Barabbas a murderer and other prisoners are taken, with Jesus to the Town Hall for the Trial.

Jesus is condemned to death and the soldiers escort everyone to the Brewery Gardens for the crucifixion. Later, in the darkness, the women arrive to take Jesus' body down from the cross to be buried.


