

A LETTER FROM MAUREEN STEVENS

"Dear Friends,

'The bliss of solitude' – a phrase from Wordsworth's poem *The Daffodils*. How often in our busy lives do some of us yearn for solitude? A time to get away from the daily demands of work, family, even church life and find a quiet place for reflection, for stillness. A time to rest and be refreshed by God's Spirit. To quote a favourite hymn:

Drop thy still dews of quietness, till all our strivings cease;

Take from our souls the strain and stress and let our ordered lives confess

The beauty of thy peace.

O to be still and know God, to feel after him and find him, to sense his love and blessing touching our lives, his reality becoming our reality. But so often there seems so much to do, so many calls on our attention.

For many, however, solitude does not mean bliss but loneliness, whether from bereavement or some other kind of enforced isolation. There is too much time to think, too much quietness.

For others, even children, there's the aloneness that comes through not fitting in, finding it difficult to make friends, being different.

Perhaps at one time or another we are all likely to experience a sense of 'aloneness', even in the midst of jovial company. It may be transitory, or it may seem like an unending road we are obliged to travel.

Jesus knew his disciples would feel very alone when the time came for him to leave them and face death and, after the resurrection, to return to his heavenly throne. He promised them a Helper, a Comforter, a Teacher – the Holy Spirit, promised to the first disciples and to all who believe in Jesus as the Son of God.

The Holy Spirit helps us to pray, helps us to understand more about God, draws us into deeper fellowship with God. The Holy Spirit will come alongside us when we make a special time and space for solitude and stillness – alone with God. The Holy Spirit is also a very real comforter and helper for the sad, bereft and lonely. He is there for all of us – God's special gift because of Jesus.

At Pentecost we celebrate the coming of the Holy Spirit to empower and equip Jesus' followers for spreading the good news about God's love. But let's also remember that the Holy Spirit comes first as the promise to each one of us who believes in Jesus as the Son of God. He comes to assure us of God's forgiveness when we turn to him; he comes to give us new life and a deep peace that we shall never be alone, never be forsaken.




Please find below what the Parish Council would like to communicate on the parish website and Two Valleys newsletter.

The Parish council have been informed that there is concern over speeding traffic at Bowland Bridge, the PC will write a letter to CCC and action on their response.

Earlier in the year the Parish Council were pleased to announce that the stone wall in Millennium Wood had now been rebuilt, we would like to request that the public please use the stiles provided. The PC currently are in contact with the LDNPA to try and change one of the stiles into a dog friendly gate. This may not be high priority for the LDNPA but the Parish Council is not legally entitled to alter the stile.

Residents are reminded to use the legal footpaths, keep dogs on a lead near stock, and please do not climb over walls or fences and to remove all dog fouling wherever it is deposited. (Including farmers fields). Every time the wall/fence is damaged it costs we council tax payers ££££'s to repair it, and risks cattle getting in, as they did last year and damaging the young trees. Residents have paid twice so far this year for repairs and now further re enforcements are needed after only a week at more cost.

Two Valleys Emergency Prayer Chain

The prayer request will then travel down the list. In the event of someone being out, a message may be left on an answerphone and the next person on the list is contacted - we will try to ensure that the request gets through to everybody in the end.

Do use the Prayer Chain again for follow up information - e.g. if you send a message that someone is extremely ill, please follow up with a message to say what the outcome is, so that those who are praying are informed. If you wish your request to be kept confidential within the Prayer Chain then make that very clear when you contact the first person and ensure they understand to pass that message on.

A Candle of the Church

Sometime in the mid-740s, the Anglo-Saxon missionary Boniface, working in what we would now call Germany, sent two letters back to England: one to the Archbishop of York, and one to the Abbot of the twin monasteries of Monkwearmouth and Jarrow, in what is now County Durham. He asked each of them if they would send to him some of the writings of 'that most wise investigator of the Scriptures.....who, as we have heard, lately shone in your midst in the house of God like a candle of the church'. The 'candle of the church', as Boniface so effectively described him, was Bede, the greatest of early medieval scholars, whose feast-day we keep on 25th May. It was extraordinary how his fame had spread: he had died as recently as 735, had scarcely ever left the monasteries of Monkwearmouth and Jarrow, and was simply a monk and a priest. But he had immersed himself in the study of the bible and had produced a vast body of interpretative commentary, drawing upon the greatest authorities: Augustine of Hippo, Jerome, Gregory the Great, and many others. This body of knowledge he expressed in Latin, the universal language of the western church, with great clarity: it was orthodoxy made accessible not by a process of dumbing down, but by virtue of his complete mastery of his subject. He also wrote sermons interpreting the set lections, which were much copied over the centuries, several highly influential works on cosmology and chronology, literary treatises on the art of writing, poetic metre and figures of speech, some verses, hymns and epigrams, historical works on St Cuthbert and the abbots of his own monastic community, and the great History of the English Church and People, for which he is still famous today (copied and recopied in the days of manuscripts and in print ever since: it's readily available in paperback).

Bede achieved so much because Benedict Biscop, the Anglo-Saxon founder of the monastic community, made a total of six journeys to Rome (five of them return trips from England, and one return trip from a monastery in France, where he had spent some time), bringing back with him collections of texts which gave Monkwearmouth and Jarrow a truly exceptional library. The foundation was also well supported and richly endowed so that it could afford the enormous expense of producing manuscript copies of Bede's work alongside many other manuscripts, including biblical texts. Some of these survive, as does some of the stonework of the two churches of Monkwearmouth and Jarrow, so that part of what we can see there today is what Bede saw fourteen hundred years ago.

Bede's name means 'prayer' in Anglo-Saxon, and maybe he was so named because he was a longed-for late child. That might account for why his family then offered him to God round about the year 680, when he was seven years old. He entered Benedict's new monastery of Monkwearmouth, where his education began, and two years later was one of the small community of monks who went to Jarrow to establish an additional monastery there. Bede remained at Jarrow for the rest of his life, serving God humbly through his scholarship. I can do no better than conclude with his own words: 'I have spent all my life in this monastery, applying myself entirely to the study of the Scriptures; and amid the observance of the discipline of the Rule and the daily task of singing in the church, it has always been my delight to learn or to teach or to write'.




