PROPOSED CROSTHWAITE AND LYTH
NEIGHBOURHOOD PLAN: DESIGNATION OF
NEIGHBOURHOOD AREA

An application has been made by Crosthwaite and Lyth Parish Council for designation of a Neighbourhood Area under Section 61G of the Town and Country Planning Act 1990.

The purpose of the application is to enable the Parish Council to prepare a Neighbourhood Plan for the area within the parish boundary.

The parish is considered to be the area most appropriate to be designated as a neighbourhood area for planning purposes.

The Lake District National Park Authority (“the Authority”) is the planning authority for the parish.

Crosthwaite and Lyth Parish Council is a ‘relevant body’ for the purposes of the 1990 Act, and is therefore qualified to undertake neighbourhood planning.

The application is now advertised for representations as to whether there is any reason why the Authority should not make the designation. Further details can be found on the following webpage
