2. Approval of Minutes for previous Meetings

Minutes for 14th August 2020 and 22nd September both approved.

3. Feedback from Parish Council meeting 6th Oct

5. Review of the Secondary Data Report

This document, produced by Megan Henderson in preparation for the HNA analysis, pulls together statistics for the parish drawn from national data and Land Registry, plus a range of datasets from SLDC and other relevant sources.

The SG reviewed the document in detail, discussing the content and raising questions for Megan. There were some issues around definitions, and an acknowledgement that Census 2011 data were rather old now (though no alternative is available).

The analysis and discussion indicated that the parish is quite dissimilar from other areas in respect of housing, working population, household income and age profile. Therefore, some of the assumptions made in key charts concerning finance/income were less applicable to this area, and might result in skewed results. It also became clear that the focus was on

affordability rather than suitability, and that suitability is not adequately addressed by the secondary data document.

After much discussion it was agreed that three of the SG (Simon, Alan and Lisa) will e-meet with Megan to discuss the points and questions on behalf of the SG.
