A LETTER FROM DOROTHY GRACE

Dear friends.

Welcome to the first printed edition since March! Thankyou to our wonderful editors for keeping the show on the road online with interesting articles despite the lack of events to include. So it's all change! Our faithful volunteer distributors and deliverers are back to work, and the printing company has business once again.

How do you feel about change? Some people embrace it, others resent it. Why? I'm getting to the age where I don't like change; it upsets my routine,



causes feelings of uncertainty and disorientation. But is it an age-related thing? Perhaps it's more about personalities. As an organized person, perhaps it's the threat of disorder that I don't like, upsetting my pattern of life. Though if we understand the reasons for the change, then we'll make an effort to accommodate it.

Many object to changes in their neighbourhood, particularly if it has a direct impact on where they live. Crosthwaite & Lyth Parish Council is currently drawing up a Neighbourhood Plan to manage any changes to different aspects of the community, particularly housing. We want our localities to thrive, but not to be swamped by inappropriate change. Can I, on behalf of the Steering Group, encourage you to complete the questionnaire that will be posted to every household in Crosthwaite & Lyth Parish.

The enforced changes of the last few months have had a huge impact on every aspect of everyone's lives. It is unlikely that we will return to life exactly as it used to be any time soon. There is some good in this; we have been forced to slow down, to look to our neighbours and community, and through this our priorities of life have been challenged. However, some have lost income and livelihood; others have also been left feeling aimless and at a loss as to how to occupy their time when all the usual commitments and tasks have disappeared. Even now, as a 'new normal' becomes established, many still feel a sense of loss, of not being as they once were. Life may start to look the same, but somehow it isn't.

A team of trained volunteers has been set up, initially for the communities of Cartmel Fell, Crosthwaite, Winster and Witherslack, to offer a listening ear and a friendly face to those who are finding life challenging for whatever reason. Details are on page 6 of the magazine; please do contact any of us if we can help in this way.

As we move through autumn, with varying Covid restrictions and the threat of a possible large-scale resurgence of the virus, how do we feel? Do we fear more change? Michael wrote about 'liminal space' in May 2020's edition, describing this in-between place of uncertainty – you may like to refer back to it; all back copies of the magazine

are on the Crosthwaite & Lyth website.

Change disorientates us, it challenges our security. The Bible tells us that God is a God of love and compassion. He knows and loves each one of us; he never changes, and is completely dependable and trustworthy. He is the firm anchor in the midst of all life's ups and downs. He offers us friendship if we turn to him and, through his Holy Spirit, the strength to cope with whatever befalls us.

Neighbourhood Plan Survey

The Neighbourhood Development Plan Steering Group has been established as a sub-committee of the Crosthwaite and Lyth Parish Council. It is made up of Parish Councillors and local volunteers. The group is working with external experts to develop a Neighbourhood Development Plan that will outline a vision for the future of the area and will include local policies to inform planning and development decisions.

The Steering Group is currently focused on collecting data and background information on the Parish and the needs of the community. This includes data collected through a Housing Needs Assessment Survey, which is being carried out this month. We ask you please to complete the survey when you receive it through the post, as it will tell us what your priorities are with respect to housing in our Parish. Your reply will be anonymous; the Steering Group will only receive the amalgamated results. The next stage will involve further consultation on which policies residents want to see in the Neighbourhood Plan.

Financing Witherslack Church

The Covid-19 pandemic has had a significant effect on all organisations and institutions. Income has been reduced and many organisations are in a very fragile and tight situation. The PCC wish to update you on how St. Paul's church is financed and why we need to look carefully at our future.

As many of you know, we have had the pressing issue of the crumbling Tower render and the general dampness in the church caused by the incorrect cement-based render applied to the tower back in the 1960s. We have been working hard to raise money for this repair and coupled it with the aim of improving the modern facilities in the church (which is the most realistic way that large Funders would be likely to support such a Project; the modern approach is to convince Funders that the building would be more widely used after their investment as they wish to see the wider community making more use of buildings such as churches). So, we have been raising awareness and inviting donations to our "Tower Fund" for many years. Many of you have already been incredibly generous in your donations to this cause, for which we are extremely grateful.

Frustratingly, Covid-19 has shut the door to many potential Funders, including the National Lottery Heritage Fund, for the time being so we are very concerned as to where we can seek to raise enough funds to complete the entire project we had in mind. We are looking now at prioritising the Tower and intend starting in early Spring 2021.



<u>However</u>, at the same time as raising money for the Tower Project, there is a second stream of income St. Paul's church has to raise each and every year and this is to sustain the ongoing costs of running a church. Broadly speaking, taking a normal year, these can be broken down into the following areas:

Ministry costs	£14,200
(provides the ministry of a local vicar, vicarage housing costs, funding church schools, etc.)	
Parish Administration costs	£560
Electricity bills + Heating Oil bills	£1130
Insurance of Church Building	£1460
Water rates	£74
Graveyard caretaker and maintenance costs	£1740
Miscellaneous (Candles, Communion wine, Harvest Supper costs, etc.)	£300

We have to raise this £19,000 plus each and every year and it is becoming increasing difficult for a small and ageing congregation to manage this on their own. Also, a bit unfair that the burden of this falls largely on such a small number of people

who feel the weight of continuing to provide a church for their local village.

Why are we telling you this? Just to raise awareness that the Tower campaign is *just one part* of all the income we have to raise each year and that it is becoming increasingly difficult to sustain this. As much as we want to raise funds for the Tower, we also need to raise funds for the above costs, otherwise there will no longer be a church that needs a Tower! We may have some tough questions to face about the sustainability of our church in Witherslack in the future.

Two Valleys Emergency Prayer Chain

Here is an updated version of our emergency Prayer Chain. Should an urgent matter for prayer occur (e.g. an accident, or someone suddenly taken ill, or an operation about to take place) and prayer be needed quickly, those at the top of the list are informed, who then telephone the next person down on the list, who then telephones the next person, and so on..... Very quickly a "chain" of prayer is set up, and each person commits themselves to pray for the situation confidentially. Please makes sure you have asked permission from the person (or family of) requiring prayer.

If you want to use the Prayer Chain, call up the people at the <u>top</u> of the list. If they are in, they will pass on the message to the next person on the chain. The prayer request will then travel down the list. In the event of someone being out, a message is left on an answerphone if possible and the next person on the list is contacted - we will try to ensure that the request gets through to everybody in the end.

Do use the Prayer Chain again for follow up information - e.g. if you send a message that someone is extremely ill, please follow up with a message to say what the outcome is, so that those who are praying are informed. If you wish your request to be kept confidential within the Prayer Chain then make that very clear when you contact the first person and ensure they understand to pass that message on.

The Authorship of the Gospels (2)

Last month I looked at some of the general issues surrounding the authorship of the Gospels and ended with an outline of the evidence for Mark being a conceivable (though unprovable) author of the Gospel bearing his name. This month it's the turn of the other three, beginning with the Gospel of Luke which, like that of Mark, is attributed to a figure who is not an apostle. There is, however, a Luke mentioned in the Epistles (Colossians 4: II, I4): a gentile and a physician. If he is the author of the Gospel, this would account for the quality of the Greek, more idiomatic and polished than that of Mark. Additionally, Acts I v. I is generally interpreted as meaning that the author of the Acts and the Gospel were the same person; and in Acts parts of the narrative use 'we', indicating that the writer accompanied Paul on some of his travels. If, then, we think of Luke as an active participant in the establishment of the early church in the generation after Christ's ministry, the hypothesis that the Gospel was written in the 80s is entirely reasonable. As with Mark, why would early tradition claim Luke as a name to lend authority to the Gospel when bigger names were available?

By contrast, Matthew and John are names of apostles and so would be perfect for lending authority to anonymous texts. But the dates are problematic. Matthew was a tax-collector and so, when called by Jesus to be an apostle, must have been an adult of some standing. If modern scholarship is right in dating the text to sometime in the last quarter of the first century, perhaps around the 80s, that raises questions, given normal life-spans and the fact that those who lived longer than average were usually rather 'older' in their 70s and 80s than people are these days. And if chronology is a problem for Matthew's Gospel, how much more is it for John's, written, it is thought, around the turn of the first century. If c.90-110 is the correct date, it would be extraordinary if John the Apostle were the author.

Matthew used Mark's Gospel as a written source, just as Luke did. We can confidently deduce that the author of this Gospel was a Jew, probably writing for a Greek-speaking Jewish community of the kind that existed in various places in Syria. But beyond that, and the fact that he was writing in the context of the second-generation of Christians, we can't draw any further conclusions.

The Gospel ascribed to John is altogether different. Firstly, it is thought to be significantly later than the other three. Secondly, it is very different in its approach. Whereas the other three (known as the Synoptic Gospels) focus on Jesus' life and ministry, John's Gospel teaches what has been called 'a high Christological doctrine', taking an altogether

more reflective approach to the divinity of Christ and the sublimity of his teaching. It both draws on and appeals to a rather different theological world, and one that best makes sense in terms of the rather later date.

The date and authorship are matters of conjecture for all four Gospels. It is at least possible to argue (though by no means agreed and certainly not provable) that the Gospels of Mark and Luke were written by the figures named in the New Testament. But for the Gospels of Matthew and John authorship remains a 'known unknown'.

I've worked at the same company for many years but I've been told I'm being made redundant. What redundancy pay am I entitled to?

If you're being made redundant, there are two types of redundancy pay you could get. 'Statutory' redundancy pay is the minimum that the law says you're entitled to, or 'contractual' redundancy pay, which is extra money your contract says you can get on top of the statutory amount.

You're usually onlyentitled to statutory redundancy pay if you've been an employee for at least two years. It's worth asking your employer or checking your contract to see if you're entitled to more than the statutory redundancy rules allow.

Statutory redundancy pay is based on age, weekly pay and number of years in the job, up to a maximum of £538 a week. The Citizens Advice and Gov.uk websites have calculators to help work out how much you'll get. For example if you're aged 41 and over, you'll get 1.5 week's statutory redundancy pay for each full year you've worked, up to a maximum of 20 years' service.

If your employer offers a suitable alternative job, but you refuse to take it without good reasons, they can refuse to pay your redundancy. You won't get statutory redundancy pay if you've been employed for less than two years, are self-employed or are in certain jobs like the armed forces or police (though you may be entitled to contractual pay).

If you've been furloughed, the law now says that your redundancy pay should be worked out using your usual wages, even if you were paid 80% while you were furloughed. However, statutory redundancy pay still limits a week's pay to £538.

If your employer has told you that your redundancy pay will be based on your furlough rate of pay, you could explain to the employer that isn't what the Gov.uk website says about redundancy pay, or contact your nearest Citizens Advice.

All The Way to Gummers How and Back

Description

A full days long walk of around 12 miles and 2000 ft of ascent. This is possibly the toughest walk in this series, so you should leave a minimum of six hours. Although you don't get very high the paths from Gummers How onwards could be confusing and you can get lost in mist. I would strongly advocate a good GPS and phone map if compass and map reading skills are limited. The walking is long but not hard.

Gummers How is always a favourite. It is the first Lakeland Fell small children should attempt. A mountain in miniature in every respect with a scramble up rocks to get to the top that requires both hands and feet and a marvellous cairn to top it off.

According to Simon Jenkins, who loves making lists, the view down to Windermere from Gummers How is in the top 100 in the UK. He includes a further dozen Lakeland viewpoints in his list, but in my opinion it's only the second best view in the "walking from Crosthwaite Green" series. Simon Jenkins had clearly never been on Whitbarrow.

The full walk takes in the abundant meadows crossing the Winster Valley, lovely views from Raven's Barrow and Sow Tarn and then you have Gummers How.

You walk back through beautiful woodland and orchards until reaching tarmac again. By then you are pleased for its certainty.

Route

The walk starts up the hill towards Bowland Bridge and then crosses a stone stile at the junction down the east of the Winster Valley towards Broad Oak. Before reaching the farm, the path turns right, crosses Woodside road and then just before reaching Bowland Bridge goes left until after Burblethwaite Mill you cross, and then follow, the river towards Cartmel Fell. It's boggy around here all year. You then need to pick your way up through Ravens Barrow allotments with regular looks back over the valley, Whitbarrow and beyond.

After turning right around Heights Cottage you then make your way past Sow How Tarn, turning right at the farm beyond. Just before the end of the Lane a path left takes you to the top of the hill leading to Gummers How.

The route up is fun and well trodden so doesn't need describing Just make your way up to the trig point on the summit the best way you can and marvel at the views.

After a rest you now need your wits about you. This is where a GPS map definitely helps as the paths north of

Gummers are indistinct and boggy. Take care to stay west of the walls and fences until reaching a wooden stile leading to Blake Holme Plantation. There is now a dry and delightful woodland path that after almost a mile turns right and then shortly afterwards left out of the wood to Moor How Park. Take care as you reach the path through the farm orchard as you now need to follow the bridle way north of the footpath towards Ludderburn Hill. Don't worry if you miss it, you just have more tarmac than necessary on the route home.

From Ludderburn take the road steeply down to Birks Bridge, over the Ford and then right down the road before reaching the path through Lambhowe plantation, then up the road to Hubbersty Head and home.

Things to see on the walk.

This is a delightful but not straightforward walk In Summer the valleys are full of cattle and sheep, all looking show-ready The orchards surrounding pretty farm houses have apples and damsons in abundance and the whole area looks like a larder to provide for many more than the lucky inhabitants of these valleys.

There are several splendid views. Looking backwards towards Crosthwaite from Ravens Barrow is terrific. The summit of Gummers How has delightful spots for picnics and picking out the steam boats and sailing yachts on Windermere below.

The walk through Blake Holme follows a beck and is one of the prettiest woodland walks imaginable.
