

A LETTER FROM SIMON HOWARD

Hello

As the most recent recruit to the ministry team Michael has asked me to write a few words to introduce myself. Where do you start? How would you describe yourself?

Well, I delight in being Bridget's husband, and have been for 37 years. I am the father of 3 wonderful grown up children and hope one day to be a grandparent. I spent my teenage years as a schoolboy in Bath, then after studying History and Physical Education at Birmingham University.



I spent my twenties as a youth worker in inner city Liverpool and London. At the age of 30 I trained for ordination at Ridley Hall in Cambridge and went on to serve my curacy in that city. That was followed by 20 years of parish ministry in Berkshire, first in Lower Earley, Reading (at the time the biggest housing development in Europe) and then in Twyford, a small commuter town on the Paddington main line.

In 2016 Bridget and I joined Lee Abbey in North Devon, an international Christian community that runs a retreat, conference, and holiday centre. I was the Senior Chaplain and we both worked on the Pastoral Team. It was an adventure of faith, a wonderful stretching and enriching experience. In the middle of it, after suffering a nasty flu virus, I developed Chronic Fatigue Syndrome. (sometimes known as M.E.). Suddenly I could hardly do anything. The preaching, the teaching, the leading worship, the listening to people, being part of the decision making and leadership of the place, most of that was gone. It felt like I was disappearing. All I could do was keep on praying and even that was too much sometimes. I wrestled with God, I mourned and lamented with God and gradually in the middle of the mess I discovered afresh who and what I really was, a much-loved child of God. That is all and, in the end, that is enough.

A year ago, for a variety of family reasons and following the gentle nudges of God, we moved from Lee Abbey to Kendal. Since then we have been seeking 'what next' and after a few false starts it emerged that God was inviting us to settle and 'be' here rather than go and 'do' a part time incumbent's role elsewhere. Part of that 'being' is offering 8 hours a week and 2 Sundays a month as a Self-Supporting Minister (SSM) in the Two Valleys Mission Community and specifically to the parish of Underbarrow with Helsington.

So here we are, about to celebrate a Christmas that will be like no other we have celebrated before. At the time of writing we don't even know if we will be able to worship in our churches on Christmas Day, let alone meet up with family and friends. One of the traumas we have all gone through in this pandemic is the stripping away of the sense of being in control of our lives.

The loss of the capacity to be able to plan ahead, to be able to do the things we want to do when we want to do them. Even if we haven't gone through the grief of losing a loved one to COVID-19 we have all had things taken away from us and are mourning their loss. In that place we may well have shouted out, or whispered in our hearts, 'God, where are you?'

As we follow the shepherds and the wise men to the stable in Bethlehem, we have the beginnings of an answer. Here he is, 'Emmanuel', 'God with us', born right in the middle of the mess of life. Out of love for us he has given up control. The 'King of Kings' comes to us as a vulnerable infant. The creator and sustainer of the universe is dependent on the love and protection of that which he has made. Although in the 2,000 years since his incarnation humanity has built cathedrals and empires in Christ's name, time and again folk have found that the words of the prophets and the angels still ring true - that it is in our poverty and powerlessness that we see Jesus most clearly. When, stripped of our own resources, all we can do is trust, then the whisper of his love grows, and we step into his Kingdom. In that moment of trust, we discover that Jesus has been here all along, in the midst of our lives, our communities, our nation, right in the middle of the mess. From that place he invites us to join with him in the messy business of loving and caring for one other and for his creation.

May we continue to discover this to be true whatever our circumstances this Christmas time.

CHRISTMAS SERVICES - PLAN A

We have to have a PLAN A and a PLAN B depending on any lockdowns still in place. PLAN A assumes we are able to be back in our churches.

Due to the restrictions imposed by the Covid-19 pandemic we are not able to sing in church and so our Christmas Services this year will feel very different. We also have limited space due to physical distancing requirements, so per-booking will be essential to guarantee you a place at certain services. You may have noticed that our **Christmas Eve Communion is at an earlier time of 9.00pm at Cartmel Fell.** This is an experiment this year to see if an earlier time on Christmas Eve proves easier for some, rather than waiting up until midnight. It is also partly due to the pandemic and the restricted nature of our services at the moment. But please pre-book as described above, to guarantee a space.

Community Christmas Trees

In trying to think of something we could offer which is Covid-safe, there will be a large Christmas Tree in the each of the following Churchyards: St. Anthony's Cartmel Fell, St. Mary's Crosthwaite, Holy Trinity Winster, and St. Paul's Witherslack. We would like to invite anyone from each local community to visit their Tree and to add a decoration to it that is weather-proof and will enhance its looks. Perhaps something for the birds to enjoy eating? Perhaps something related to the Christmas Story? We are also leaving some large wooden labels upon which we invite you to write a message or prayer request and then hang on the Tree.

This is at least something we can do safely across each Community. Look out for these Christmas Trees in the fortnight before Christmas and make a point of visiting them....

Christmas Trees

You can't imagine Christmas without Christmas trees. But why this association? In historical terms the answer to 'why' in this country is Prince Albert. It wasn't, as people often think, that he introduced the Christmas tree into England. In fact, the first instance that we know of in this country when someone decorated an entire small tree for Christmas was in 1800. when George III's wife, Charlotte of Mecklenberg-Strelitz, had a Christmas tree at a children's party. Queen Victoria, as a child, was familiar with the custom, although it did not at first spread much beyond the royal family. In 1840, however, Victoria married Albert. He, like Queen Charlotte, knew the custom in his native Germany, and the decorated tree became the centre-piece of their family celebrations. The idea quickly caught on amongst the upper classes. But the trigger for its wider popularity was an engraving made for Christmas 1848, which showed a decorated tree, surrounded by Victoria, Albert and all of their children (six of them by that date). This was published in the Illustrated London News along with a detailed description. There was no looking back: better-off people wanted to emulate the royal family, and Christmas trees soon featured at public entertainments, charity events and in hospitals. There was even a charity set up in 1906 to make sure that poor children in the London slums, who had never seen a Christmas tree, would be able to enjoy one.

Answering the question this way, though, is too limited: we need to go farther back to understand why the tradition grew up at all. Christmas, which was celebrated from the fourth century onwards, is a mid-winter festival, close to the winter solstice, celebrated by many cultures. Such festivities marked the point when, although the sun was now at its lowest, the year was on the turn, bringing with it hopeful anticipation that the hardships of winter would not last much longer, and that spring and the new growing season would indeed come round again. And so, along with the feasting and partying, evergreen plants, such as holly, ivy and mistletoe were used for decoration to symbolise the hope of new life. When the date of Christmas was fixed in the Christian calendar, close to - although not on - the dates of the great pagan festivals, many of the popular customs continued, with the Christian celebrations eventually supplanting the older festivals. By the fifteenth century we have evidence of decorated evergreen trees being set up for Christmas in the region of modern Estonia and Latvia, from which the custom spread to northern Germany. After the Reformation, trees such as this were to be seen in the houses of upper-class Protestant families as an alternative to Christmas cribs, which were then firmly associated with Roman Catholicism. The popularity of decorated Christmas trees was boosted by German emigration to North America and in Britain and throughout the Empire by the example of Victoria and Albert. Only at the start of the twentieth century, though, do we begin to see Christmas trees appearing inside churches - sometimes meeting considerable resistance on the grounds that they were pagan symbols. However, being evergreens, they serve well as symbols of continuing life in a dark time and of hope for the coming of new life. Looked at in this way, they are fitting symbols of the message of Christmas - evergreen life, the promise of hope, and, in the way they are customarily decorated, bearers of lights which illuminate the darkness.

Housing Needs Assessment Study

A big **thankyou** to everyone who completed a questionnaire for Crosthwaite & Lyth Parish Council's Housing Need Study. Megan Henderson received 172 completed documents from Parish residents, representing 49% of all postal addresses, and 11 questionnaires from people currently living outside the Parish. She will process all these and give the final analysis and conclusion to the Parish Council's Neighbourhood Plan Steering Group by mid-January.

What happens next?

The Housing Needs survey outcome forms a major part of evidence-gathering for a Neighbourhood Development Plan (NDP) for Crosthwaite & Lyth Parish. The results will be fed into a larger document looking at a range of aspects of the Parish: housing; natural environment; community facilities, sustainability and local businesses. The document then goes through further refinement cycles through community consultation and discussion with the Lake District National Park. Finally, there is a community referendum on the refined version.

I'd like some advice on keeping my energy bills down please. I work in admin for a big corporation. We are working from home with no idea when we'll be back in the office. I'm freezing sitting here all day in front of my computer! I'm worried if I turn the heating up my bills are going to go through the roof.

Fortunately, there's lots you can do to keep bills down.

Firstly, see if you can get a better deal by changing your energy supplier. However, as well as comparing prices, it's a good idea to check the customer service record of a company before switching. Citizens Advice has a price comparison tool on our website, and our star rating assesses the customer service records of the 40 biggest companies.

There are also little, everyday things that can help, such as making sure televisions and other devices are switched off and not left on standby; washing clothes on a lower temperature; and only filling the kettle with the water you need.

You're right in another way about bills going through the roof - and the walls. One way of cutting costs in the long term is to invest in good insulation - or ask your landlord to do so.

If your pay is close to the national minimum wage, the extra costs of working from home could be counted as a pay cut and bring you below the legal level. Talk to your manager or HR department, or your union rep if you have one.

Finally, your employer should pay for any costs connected to your health and safety - such as a suitable chair for work at a computer. It's also worth taking a look at your employer's expenses policy as you may be able to claim for a number of other things, such as printer ink or telephone line rental.

Please makes sure you have asked permission from the person (or family of) requiring prayer.

In the event of someone being out, a message is left on an answerphone if possible and the next person on the list is contacted - we will try to ensure that the request gets through to everybody in the end.

Do use the Prayer Chain again for follow up information - e.g. if you send a message that someone is extremely ill, please follow up with a message to say what the outcome is, so that those who are praying are informed. If you wish your request to be kept confidential within the Prayer Chain then make that very clear when you contact the first person and ensure they understand to pass that message on.

Perhaps consider the recent world of the Archbishops of Canterbury and York:

"First, let us be **Calm**. By only buying what we need and not hoarding, or by reaching out to our neighbours as we did during the first lockdown, we can be stronger together in ways that are impossible if we go it alone. When things go wrong - as they always will with such complex challenges - let us look for good and right ways forward together.

Secondly, let's be **COUTAGEOUS**. There are many reasons to be fearful at the moment, but the story of Christ calming the waves calls us to give our fears to Jesus and have faith in Him. The British willingness just to get on with things is one of our very best characteristics – let us not be paralysed by fear. We will all need each other's courage in the months to come.

Thirdly, let's be **compassionate**. So many of us are holding so much pain - our own and the pain of those we love. We will need to be gentle, kind and patient with each other. In the first wave we showed we are a nation of compassion and kindness. Let's dig deep and keep that love for our neighbours strong in this second time of struggle".
