### A LETTER FROM MICHAEL WOODCOCK

#### Dear friends.

We have been learning many things over the past 18 months; not least our need for each other. Human contact has been so severely restricted and very much missed by many people. At the same time, we have been reminded that we struggle to manage life on our own. No one can do it all – feed, clothe, heal, comfort, house, employ, and educate – either for ourselves or our families. Our particular brand of western society has encouraged independence and individualism for a long time, but at what cost? The pandemic suddenly threw us into a state of existing which exposed the weaknesses of such individualism.



It has been argued that from the very beginnings, humankind has worked together in mutually beneficial ways in order to survive. Particularly through times of crisis, humanity has needed to pull together; over thousands of years we have collaborated, traded, and built cultures. We have created federations and large and loose organizations of reciprocity, all of which have helped to sustain life, despite the inevitable disagreements and wars that have punctuated human history.

We face such times again now. Helping and caring for one another through this pandemic has been brought into focus: at a very local level as we look after our immediate neighbours; on a national scale as we have sought to overcome covid-19 across the UK; and now the challenge remains for the global community to work together in seeking to vaccinate all countries.

As the pandemic has been subsiding, we have also been reminded again of the greater threat of climate change as we have seen almost weekly reports of extreme weather, floods and fires, in all parts of the world, and an increasing sense of real urgency now that things have to change – we can't play around with this issue any longer.

We need each other and we need to co-operate and work collaboratively. In the Christian tradition we have the accounts of the feeding of thousands from just a few loaves and fishes (see Matthew 14, Mark 6, Luke 9 and John 6). This records a miracle and the "breaking in" of God's power from heaven to earth in order to demonstrate his reality. But the feeding of so many also relied on the willingness of the few to share what little they had. A further interpretation of this event suggests the "miracle" was the generosity lying dormant within the crowds. The resources were there waiting to be called forth.

We have many challenges ahead of us, as we emerge from the effects of these past 18 months, but also as we face the challenges of a changing climate. Dorothy Day (1897–1980), the founder of the Catholic Worker, called her book about the movement Loaves and Fishes. She wrote:

"Young people say, 'What good can one person do? What is the sense of our small effort?' They cannot see that we must lay one brick at a time, take one step at a time; we can be responsible only for the one action of the present moment. But we can beg for an increase of love in our hearts that will vitalize and transform all our individual actions and know that God will take them and multiply them, as Jesus multiplied the loaves and fishes."

We need each other. We need to work together in order to flourish. The potential is there within us, as we have seen in countless examples of service and generosity over recent months. We now need to take that momentum forward and not let it slip. And with God, all things are possible.

### **Martyrs**

At the end of June I had the great pleasure of visiting the British Museum's exhibition about Thomas of Canterbury. He was killed on 29 December 1170 and was canonised by Pope Alexander III in 1173. The extraordinary speed with which he was sanctified as a martyr and the equally extraordinary speed with which his cult spread were of course results of the high profile of the murder and the sensational sequence of events: King versus Archbishop, the knights killing Thomas within the very walls of his own cathedral, and then Henry II's spectacular public penance. But the cult's energetic promotion was because the archbishop's death was instantly weaponised by the church in a European wide struggle between the religious and secular powers in these centuries.

Politics and martyrdom have often been intertwined, never more so than in the 'Age of Martyrs' in the first three centuries of Christianity. The great waves of Roman persecution coincided with times of political difficulty, either because the emperor himself needed to find scapegoats (as in the case of Nero in the first century) or, more usually, because the empire itself was under stress (as in the time of Diocletian at the end of the third). The Romans generally didn't bother much about what people actually believed. But what they were concerned about was adherence to social norms in support of social order; and it was when they tightened up on these, as a way of exerting authority at a time of threat, that Christians fell foul of law and custom and were then killed as convenient public examples of what happens to those who refused to comply. The actual beliefs of the victims were not closely enquired into; the issues, rather, were their refusal to conform, their tendency to cohere as a group apart, holding to a loyalty above the emperor, and their practice of meeting in secret, which created huge suspicion in an empire always paranoid about secret societies. Religious toleration was pronounced by Constantine in 313, and in the late fourth century Christianity became the official religion of the empire. This radical change marked the end of the 'Age of Martyrs', but not, of course, the end of martyrdoms. The difference was that there were fewer mass martyrdoms; and circumstances were usually more particular and individualised, although not necessarily separated from politics, just as Thomas's was not, nor the killings of Latimer, Ridley and Cranmer, commemorated by the Martyrs' Memorial in Oxford. They were burnt at the stake for their protestant beliefs when Mary Tudor led England back to Rome for the short duration of her reign. Martyrs have often been victims of conflicts within Christianity itself.

In the light of history, we define a 'martyr' as someone who suffers persecution and death for resolutely upholding and so 'witnessing to' their religious belief. When, in Acts I v.8, Jesus tells the disciples that they will receive the Holy Spirit and so be empowered to become 'witnesses' to Christ throughout the world, the word used is  $\mu \dot{\alpha} \rho \tau \upsilon \rho \epsilon \varsigma$  [martyrs]. This is nothing to do with how they will die; it is all about how they will spread the gospel, how they will be 'witnesses' to what they have seen and learnt. Witnessing to the power of faith to the point of death is the most extreme form of public witness. These repeated examples across the centuries, inspiring believers and sometimes even converting non-believers, are why the word 'martyr' has come to have the specialised meaning that it does today.

My Universal Credit is going to be cut by £20 a week. I struggle to get by as it is and I'm really worried that I'll get into serious debt. I'm already behind on some of my bills. What can I do to avoid things getting worse?

You're not alone in this - there is support available.

Firstly, depending on your situation, you might be able to ask to have your Universal Credit paid differently - these are called 'alternative payment arrangements'. This might be an option if you're in rent arrears, among other reasons. To apply for an alternative payment arrangement, call the Universal Credit helpline on: 0800 328 5644.

If you're behind on some of your bills, the first step is to make a list of how much you owe and add up how much you need to pay each month.

You now need to prioritise your debts. We have <u>advice on our website</u> to help you do this. Some bills can cause you more problems than others if you don't pay them. Rent or mortgage arrears, energy bills and council tax are your priority debts as there can be serious consequences if you don't pay them.

Be sure to get in touch with the organisations you owe money to. Not everyone feels confident to do this, but they might be able to help by letting you pay smaller amounts or taking a break from payments. Many organisations have put in place protections for people who've struggled to pay their bills during the pandemic.

The government-backed <u>Breathing Space</u> scheme could also give you extra time. If you're eligible, you could get 60 days where your creditors can't contact you, take action to make you pay, or add interest and charges to your debt. You'll need to get advice from a debt adviser first - they'll check all your debts to see if they're covered by the scheme.

Finally, it's always a good idea to have a budget - take a look at the <u>budgeting tool</u> on our website and make sure you're getting all the <u>income</u> you're entitled to.

Everyone's circumstances are different, particularly when it comes to managing personal finances. If you need more specific support or don't feel able to manage your situation alone, call us on 015394 46464. ### **CROOK**

The B4RN Group is very active. Having learned from the experiences of the other parishes in the Two Valleys it is hoped that the very large area covered by the Crook Group will become viable. The sign-up stage has been reached and it is hoped to encourage as many as



possible to participate in this community effort; even those who have acceptable reception at present. Almost every property has now been leafleted and routes and wayleaves are being considered. The prospect of amazingly fast broadband will be of interest to everyone in the future, as technology progresses.

Several matters were considered at the recent meeting of Crook and Winster Parish Council. There is concern at the additional amount of traffic on the B5284, probably due to the signing at the roundabout at Plumgarths. There was no prior warning given that visitors would be advised to take this route to Bowness rather than continue on the main road. The matter of poor surfaces on several roads in the parishes continues to be a problem. Councillor Bland will enquire about the replacement of the bent sign post just past the Staveley road junction and it is also soon hoped to install a Speed Indicator Device on the B5284 at that end of Crook.

As restrictions are eased events and classes are gradually returning to the Memorial Hall. The Annual Meeting of the Hall Trustees was recently held and it was noted that the central heating boiler has been replaced and that several maintenance jobs have been completed.

### **HOW TO BUILD A VICARAGE**

It must have "two sitting-rooms, not less than sixteen feet by fourteen, a study about fourteen by twelve ...... and no fewer than five bedrooms, each bedroom having a fireplace."

If you were an aspiring vicar in the late 1800s and wanted your status in the feudal scene to be recognised, then you might want one of these new vicarages. Many villages have them – large, imposing, and usually in the gothic style. Also very cold and draughty, but that was not the point.

You would apply to the Ecclesiastical Commissioners at No. 10, Whitehall Place, London, and they would supply you with a copy of the June 1868 edition of the "Rules and Instructions respecting Parsonage Houses, to which strict attention is particularly requested". And if you wanted the funding – about £1,500 – then you had better do as you were told!

In my collection of largely useless bits of information I have a copy of these Rules and Instructions and they make quite interesting reading. They were issued, they stated, "having regard on the one hand, to the limited income of those benefices for which they assist ......, and on the other hand to the importance of securing to every clergyman a convenient and comfortable residence.....".

The vicar was certainly not given a free hand in the project. "There should also be a pantry or china closet, larder, water closet, wine and beer cellar, coal-house, dustbin etc". Nothing too modest then! Detailed specifications and an estimate were to be sent to the Commissioners for prior approval, and the money would be released in instalments as the work proceeded.

The Rules and Instructions then went on to prescribe in great detail such things as the types of wood to be used in the window-cills, the roof and all external woodwork, as well as the thickness of the walls and the spaces between the rafters and joists. The middle roof and parapet gutters were to be of "seven pound lead", the slates fixed with copper nails, and the rain-water pipes to be of cast iron protected by four coats of paint.

There is a footnote to the effect that the vicar did however have a free hand in choosing the wallpaper, which I am sure made him and his wife feel much empowered. And, of course, they were free to choose their live-in domestic staff.


