A LETTER FROM DOROTHY GRACE

October tends to be the time for harvest festivals, for giving thanks for the produce of the land, from livestock and grass crops to fruit from the orchards. As I write this in early September, the damsons in our small orchard are ripe and the apples will be ready shortly. The blackberries are succulent and plentiful—the sheer generosity of nature displayed in unkempt corners of the garden and in the hedgerows.



At the bottom of the garden I came across a cluster of ripe blackberries right next to a ripening yellow and red necklace of black bryony berries, reminding me that the bounty of nature is not just for our benefit; rather, it is part of a much wider, interwoven food chain that sustains all life on earth. We won't harvest all our damsons or apples, so that the remaining fruit will be food for the birds and other creatures that live in, or visit, our garden throughout the autumn and winter.

This cycle of life has continued largely unaffected by the Covid pandemic, while our lives have been impacted significantly. Even though restrictions have largely been lifted, this doesn't mean that life has gone back to how it was 18 months ago. A year ago, in my letter, I wrote: "Even now, as a 'new normal' becomes established, many still feel a sense of loss, of not being as they once were. Life may start to look the same, but somehow it isn't". I don't know about you, but I think this is still true; perhaps we have lost some confidence, not wanting to be in close contact with others, yet missing the comfort and joy of a hug from a friend or loved one.

As Rev Michael Woodcock wrote last month, our Western society's focus on the individual, on self-sufficiency, has been challenged by the pandemic, and we have realised how important are our friends, family and community. A recent article from the London Institute for Contemporary Christianity says: "Already popular, the concept of 'self-care' has gained further momentum during the pandemic, with Google searches for 'self-care routine' up 250% since the first lockdown. 'Self-care' means responding to your limits and needs to protect your physical, emotional, and mental wellbeing". These routines may include exercise, a particular diet or mindfulness, and may bring benefits; however, they are grounded in self-sufficiency, because we're worth it, 'we are enough'.

The article continues: "Self-care makes helpful suggestions but hollow promises". The issues it claims to address — unfulfillment, exhaustion from overcommitment, lack of connection — are only answered adequately by someone who offers true purpose, grace, and love. We can exercise, eat, and sleep well to protect our God-given bodies and minds. We can enjoy time with loved ones, recognising that God designed us for community. We can cherish beautiful music, films, nature and food, and praise the Creator. We can meditate, not on our own capacity, but on God's faithfulness and promises. Real 'self-care' means trusting the care of ourselves daily to God, who promises rest for the weary and burdened:

'Take my yoke upon you and learn from me, for I am gentle and humble in heart, and you will find rest for your souls' (Matthew II:28-29).

We will aim to meet back at the church for around 12.30pm for a bring-your-own Picnic if you would like to bring one and stay. Simon and Jude, Apostles

There are two red-letter days this month in the Common Worship calendar: Luke on 18 October (about whom I've written before), and Simon and Jude on 28 Oct. All three are apostles, which is why their commemorations are marked as principal feasts. But in fact we know very little about Simon and Jude from the gospels and, although there are some legends associated with them, this is sparse compared with some other apostolic saints. As a result, they don't figure prominently in Christian art either. It's odd that one feels the need to begin by making clear who they are not. Simon is not Simon Peter; and Jude is not Judas Iscariot. The gospels are careful about this too.

In the lists of apostles in Matthew 10, Mark 3, and Luke 6, the two Simons are distinguished by the name of Peter being attached to the first, and the second being identified as Simon the Zealot. In Luke this identifying term is ζηλωτης (zelotes) from the Greek ζηλος (zelos), meaning 'hotness', the corresponding verb meaning 'to seethe', or 'to boil'. This is also the way this Simon is identified in the list of apostles in Acts I unsurprisingly, given that Acts and Luke are considered to have the same author. In Matthew and Mark, on the other hand, the identifying term is (in transliteration) kananaoios or kananites, depending on the manuscript. This was misinterpreted early on (including by Jerome, no less!) as indicating that Simon was from the town of Cana, or from the region of Canaan. This is what we have in the King James Bible: Simon the Canaanite. But kananaoios or kananites is actually an attempt to record in Greek the Hebrew word for 'zealous', qanai when written in our alphabet. So modern English bibles take account of this and distinguish Simon as 'zealot' in all three synoptic gospels and in Acts; they are all saying the same thing about him, but using different words, one pure Greek and the other representing Hebrew. 'Zealots' was a name given to a Jewish party of revolt against the Romans round about 70 AD, but this is unlikely to be relevant for Simon the Apostle. For him 'zealot' is probably a personal description, 'the zealous', perhaps originally in keeping the Law of Moses, and then in following Christ.

Jude is even more elusive. In the list of apostles in Luke 6 he is referred to as 'Judas of James', most naturally taken to mean - and usually translated as - son of James, though we don't know who that James was. In John 14 he is 'Judas, not Iscariot', which points to why we generally modify his name from Judas to Jude: it makes the distinction clearer. But the lists of apostles in Matthew and Mark don't include a Jude/Judas in addition to Judas Iscariot. Instead, they include a Thaddeus or Lebbaeus (depending on the manuscript). The general supposition is that this is an alternative name for Jude. In some church traditions Thaddeus is the name standardly used, as we see from dedications and shrines, neatly eliminating any risk of confusion.

Beyond this there is not much that can be said, except that there is no firm evidence for Jude being the author of the Epistle bearing his name. According to legend Simon and Jude were martyred together in the town we know as Beirut (then in the Roman province of Syria), and so that is why we commemorate them on the same day.

I'm a single parent and lost my job during the pandemic. My local Citizens Advice helped me apply for Universal Credit which has been really helpful to cover some of the income I've lost. But I'm very worried about my children,

especially buying their school uniforms and shoes, now they are growing so fast! Is there any support out there until I can find another job?

If you're on a low income or unemployed, you might be able to get help with some of the costs of sending your child to school, including school meals, transport and uniform. It's always worth talking to your local education authority to see what support is available.

Free school meals

Children in Reception, Year I and Year 2 automatically get free school meals. If you have older children you can apply for free school meals if you get certain benefits. In your case as you're on Universal Credit and you applied after I April 2018 you would be eligible if you earn less than £7,400 a year without benefits. You can see the full list of eligibility requirements on the Citizens Advice website. To apply for free school meals you need to contact your local authority, you can check the details at Gov.uk by typing your postcode in.

Transport

If your children are aged between 5 and 16, your local education authority might offer free or lower cost transport if you don't live near school or your child's unable to walk there. You need to apply to your local education authority for help.

Uniforms and other costs

Your local education authority might also be able to help with some other costs, like uniforms, music lessons or trips and activities. There may also be local charitable schemes to help with these costs. It's worth checking with the school to see if it knows of any. If you live in South Lakeland, contact South Lakes Citizens Advice as they may be able to help with sourcing grants. Schools can sometimes also advise on finding secondhand uniforms.

What's next

If your child is staying in education after year 11, you must tell HMRC's Child Benefit Office if you want to continue receiving child benefit and any extra support for children within means-tested benefits. When your child turns 16, HMRC will send you a letter asking whether your child will stay in education or training. You must reply to this letter to keep getting Child Benefit.


