A LETTER FROM HILARY FITCH

'Kind' and 'kindness' are fairly ordinary words but I have noticed over the last few months that they seemed to be popping up more frequently on social media, in the news, on the radio and in daily prayers. The pandemic is partly responsible for this, as the isolation of lockdown and the needs of friends, neighbours and family, spurred people on to be kind, often in quite creative ways. In the villages of the Two Valleys, groups formed that got shopping and medication for people who were shielding; telephone networks kept people in touch; morning coffee or evening drinks were enjoyed together by friends on Zoom. More recently there was a programme on Radio 4 called 'The Kindness Test', done in collaboration with the University of Sussex (still available on BBC Sounds). All this focus on 'kindness' piqued my interest, so I decided to find out more.



If we want a definition, 'kindness' can be described as actions which are generous, helpful and caring towards other people. Instinctively, we all seem to know what kindness is, how it feels and how it makes a difference to our wellbeing when somebody does something which is intended for our benefit. I have got into the habit of saying 'Oh thank you, that's kind' to someone who does a kindness to me because I think that this is affirming the person's behaviour so that they know it has been appreciated as a kind act.

'Kindness' has become part of serious multidisciplinary academic study, including psychology, neuroscience, business, education, social sciences and politics. Psychology indicates that positive emotions are necessary for human beings to flourish. Neuroscience research on the brain reveals that those doing a kindness experience a reward, a 'warm glow', which originates from the same part of the brain that is stimulated by pleasant experiences such as nice food or a lovely gift. So the doer and receiver of the kindness both benefit – in the words of Hada Bejar, Cuban actress and writer, "The fragrance always remains in the hand that gives the rose".

'Kindness' has been found to be a good model for businesses. If business leaders are kind, then it gives the others within the organisation permission to be kind also. Apparently, this leads to workers being more loyal and hardworking – a bit of a contrast to the 'you're fired' model of business relations! In schools, workshops are used to encourage pupils to be kind and considerate of others, and it has also been suggested that politics would produce better outcomes if it were run with more compassion and kindness rather than the gladiatorial contest we seem to have at present. Kindness is often confused with being weak, put upon and indecisive, but studies show that leadership can be both strong and kind.

I found all the research I did interesting, positive and quite cheering-institutions, business and politics based on kindness! We perhaps tend to think of kindness on a smaller scale, between friends or family members, but it can be bigger, more farreaching and can break through barriers.

From a Christian viewpoint, being a follower of Jesus should result in the fruit of God's indwelling Spirit-love, joy, peace, forbearance, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness and self-control. (Galatians 5:22-23). Kindness appears in this list, but all these attributes work together to produce the fruit. Kindness, and indeed all these other qualities, are like a muscle – the more we use it, the stronger it gets and the more it becomes part of life. We become more connected with each other and with God.

MYSTERY visitor lands in Crosthwaite

The associated photograph of the mystery visitor is on page 27.

We were just setting off for a walk around the village in early October after a blustery couple of days. Our neighbour at Tarnside met us as we were passing, to ask if we could identify a mystery bird that had landed in her garden, and was clearly in distress.

Expecting to see an unusual small bird such as a finch, we were astonished to see a large sea bird sheltering amongst her compost bins and plant pots. After jointly consulting our bird guides, we decided it was a guillemot. They are birds of the deep sea and rocky coasts, habitats a long way from Crosthwaite. It appeared uninjured, but clearly exhausted and thoroughly dejected. It would have been unlikely to survive the night where it was, and apart from tinned sardines, we had no food to offer it.

We decided that its only chance of survival was to return it to the sea. John set off with the bird in a box, covered with blankets in the boot of our car, for Walney. Unfortunately, the sea was just about as far out as it could be, but he found a suitable spot at the south end of the island, where there were large tidal pools leading out to the open sea.

As soon as the box lid was off, and it could see and smell the sea, it's spirits revived. Flapping its wings and squawking loudly, it was released into the water. It immediately headed off, paddling, preening itself, taking short dives and very much alive. As long as it found food fairly quickly, its chances of survival seemed good.

How did it come to be in a Crosthwaite garden? It will remain a mystery.

Guillemots only lay one egg each breeding season, and many fail to survive to maturity. All seabirds are in serious decline, so hopefully driving to Walney to give just one a chance of survival was worthwhile.

I'm moving into a shared house with friends for the first time. Although I'm excited, I'm also a bit nervous as I've never rented from a private landlord before. What should I look out for when I move in?

Most landlords are reasonable people who look after their properties and tenants well, but it's always a good idea to know your rights. Here's a checklist of things to do when you first move in:

Make sure you have your landlord's contact details. Your landlord is responsible for keeping your home in good condition and arranging repairs when they're needed. They should be your first point of contact if anything goes wrong.

Make sure your deposit is protected. Check that your landlord has given you information about the scheme used to protect your deposit.

Take photos on the day you move in. It's also worth asking your landlord or letting agent for an inventory, to check everything is in order. Use this to note down any problems and the condition of the furniture, kitchen, carpets, bathroom etc.

Check if you're in a 'house in multiple occupation'. If you're living with two or more people who aren't part of your family, and share a toilet, bathroom or kitchen with you, this is considered an HMO. This means your landlord must make sure your home meets certain safety standards. This includes making sure smoke alarms are installed and there's a safe fire exit. The landlord must also ensure shared areas such as staircases and corridors are clean and in good repair. Some HMOs need to be licensed by the council - if you're unsure whether this applies to your home, check with your local council.

Make sure your landlord gives you: a copy of the Gas Safety Certificate, an Energy Performance Certificate and a How to Rent leaflet.

Understand your tenancy agreement. It's important to know who's responsible for paying bills and what to do if there are any changes, like if someone wants to move out. The <u>Citizens Advice website</u> explains the different ways shared accommodation can be organised.

If you encounter a problem with the property, contact your landlord. If it relates to disrepair, for example if your heating system fails or there's damp in the property, it's best to put this in writing so that you have evidence if you need it later. The landlord shouldn't come in without your permission.

If your landlord is unresponsive or refuses to help, contact South Lakes Citizens Advice for support. In serious cases, for example if your health or safety is at risk, you may be advised to contact the council.

AIR TRAVEL - A SIDEWAYS LOOK

I have never been terribly enthusiastic about air travel. Airports are bewildering and unsettling, not to mention the hassle of getting there – parking the car and catching the shuttle-bus. And aeroplanes are cramped, the food is nothing to look forward to – at least in the class that we travel – and you never knew what germs the air-conditioning is circulating.



That was B.C. (Before Covid), and now I am even more reluctant to travel in these big flying tubes. There is the nightmare of getting all the paperwork right (and loading it onto your smart-phone if you have one), and being scrutinised even more closely by suspicious officials who regard you as potentially a virus spreader as well as a terrorist. And on top of that, we are now more than ever aware of the environmental damage caused by air travel.

The late Spike Milligan suggested that a retro plane might encourage senior citizens like me to feel more comfortable with this mode of transport. He suggested a Victorian gas-lit airliner, with the air hostesses wearing crinolines and bustles, stewards in full naval uniform, and the crew dressed as Grenadier Guards. When passing over Italy, they should, he said, change to tropical whites.

The walls of the plane would be covered in William Morris style wall-paper and the seats in buttoned velvet with brass fittings. There would be heavy velvet curtains and oil paintings by Landseer. The First Class would have a marble floor with potted palm trees and music provided by a trio on violin, cello and harp. Economy Class, Milligan suggests, would have a Folk Trio and a conjuror. There would be a wood-burning stove placed between the pilot and co-pilot for warmth at higher altitudes. The background music on take-off would be "Land of Hope and Glory" and on landing "God save the Queen", accompanied by salutes from the crew and a hearty three cheers from the passengers.

I think that I could go along with this and might buy a ticket for the first gas-lit flight – especially if the airport could be designed in like fashion and perhaps named Manchester Terminal three and a half.



WITHERSLACK

The Dean Barwick Educational Trust Post 16 Grant

When John Barwick died in 1664 he was the Dean of St Paul's Cathedral in London. He bequeathed money for a

church and school to be built in Witherslack village where he grew up.



The following grants are available to students entering Post 16 education;

Course grant

£300 a year towards books and educational equipment, (available for two years of a degree or further educational course). A third year grant of £400 is awarded in the final year of study.

Apprentice grant

A one off £500 grant to assist with buying tools and equipment for an apprenticeship.

The factors taken into account by the Trustees when considering applications include but are not limited to:

- 1. Must be currently resident in the parish of Witherslack, Meathop and Ulpha
- 2. Attended Dean Barwick Primary School for at least one academic school year i.e. 3 terms between Reception and Year 6.
- 3. Undertaking a recognised F.E. qualification, university course or formal apprenticeship.
- 4. Not received a grant, (or series of grants) before.
- 5. An application should include home address and course attended.
- 6. For the apprenticeship grant, a letter from the employer is needed.

Grant applications are considered at the Trustee meeting in November. Please ensure that your letter of application makes reference to the above factors. Applications must be received by the Trust by no later than Monday 8th November. If a grant is awarded, it is expected that you let the Trustees know, (letter/email) how you have used the grant money and whether you are continuing on the course by no later than the following November meeting.

BRIGSTEER

Following last month's return to the Village Hall, we were glad to gather there again for our October meeting and talk by Vanda Lambton. Vanda's talent in the use of various materials for a range of creative projects was evident as she demonstrated blocking a sinamay percher hat. We learnt that sinamay is one of the most popular hat-making materials, woven in the Philippines from abaca plant fibres, and is very long-lasting. After the demonstration Vanda invited us to try on the selection of hats she had brought along, and ladies couldn't resist viewing themselves from all angles in the mirrors, deciding which might suit them best for the next "hat occasion" - or simply for the fun of trying on. 
