A LETTER FROM GEORGE BRIGGS

I like telling the story of when my cousin's twins came home and announced they had a part in their school Nativity. What part is it? Alligators, they said. Oh, she replied. The next day they returned with a correction: not Alligators, Navigators, they said. Right, she replied – thinking the costume would at least be easier. The next day they returned from school with the script marked Narrators. Suddenly things became clearer! Have you ever taken part in a Nativity Play? Who were you? The narrator? An Angel, or the Angel? Mary or Joseph, the innkeeper – or the innkeeper's wife, shepherds, animal extras, wise men, stars...?



There are lots of characters in the nativity – all had a very different experience of the first Christmas. Mary and Joseph at least knew some of what was coming but it was a complicated and exhausting journey to get there, quite possibly made more difficult by family tensions it may have been good to leave behind. What about the Innkeeper, busy as never before with the census, but a hectic time too, and embarrassing and awkward having nowhere better than the stable for the young mother to have her baby. What about the angels, they seemed to have a great night! Singing, shouting, they simply couldn't keep it in! The shepherds really weren't expecting anything, and got the fright of their lives, and then the night of their lives when the angel told them: God's doing something amazing – see for yourselves, and they did! As for the donkey and the animals – a bit of unusual activity, a few visitors, and an unidentified sleeping object in the feeding trough, but essentially it was a pretty good night. Then there are a few other cast members: Herod, his advisors, the Magi... I wonder whether our Christmas will be anything like any of theirs.

I wonder what your plans are for Christmas. In the story, basically there seem to be two kinds of Christmas – there are those who got wind of the story but didn't get too close because Christmas didn't seem to be good news – Herod was actually really quite afraid of the implications, and his advisors knew all about God but thought Christmas a very doubtful event and were above going to look for themselves: Christmas definitely wasn't joyful for these few.

Then we look at those who got caught up in the story, some more deliberately than others, and they all got to encounter something quite extraordinary and unusual and each came away knowing that God was up to something truly beautiful, that he had chosen to make his home with us, and offer us life – with forgiveness, hope and joy.

My prayer for you and for me this Christmas is that we'll find ourselves like those in the second group: for whom that first Christmas was wild, surprising, and if challenging ultimately an astonishing time of discovering just how far God will go to reach us, and to draw us to his love!

Happy Christmas and every blessing for 2022!

CALLING ALL VILLAGES

Two Valleys Mission Community House Groups What is a house group? Well, it's a group of people, perhaps 8-10 individuals, who meet together regularly (possibly every fortnight or once a month) in someone's home to study and discuss aspects of the Christian faith. This could be anything from a Bible passage or a character in the Bible to a current issue that affects us personally – it can be wide-ranging. There will be a designated leader for each group to coordinate its meetings, but not necessarily to lead or host the meetings – this could be a shared role. Each group will decide itself how frequently to meet, and where and what time of day, depending on where people live and availability during the day or evening.

A Grand Time Out at the Lido

In winter, with its chilly weather, short daylight hours and overcast skies, it is hard to imagine those long summer days of childhood, but there has been much in the local press recently about the prospective restoration of a structure that has meant much to those who spent their younger years in this area, and I wonder how many readers have similar memories of summer days spent at one of our local attractions – the Lido at Grange-over-Sands.

I arrived at Arnside National (Primary) School in 1954 aged nine and I was enthralled when, once a week in the summer, armed with swimming costumes and towels and a few pence in a purse, we formed a "crocodile" (remember those??) and set off down the footpath from the school to the railway station to board the steam train to Grange-over-Sands – fare, I think, six old pence return. At Grange station, we formed up again into our crocodile and walked along the promenade to the pool. Some of us could already swim, others received instructions from the accompanying teacher. The water was salty (pumped up from the estuary below) and chilly, but at that age you take things as you find them and get on with the fun.

After half an hour or so we dried off, got changed, and made our way up to the cafe. Before entering we put our wet costumes through the huge, intimidating rollers of a large mangle with a crank-handle that squeezed the garment almost dry. It did cross my mind, I think, that an error of judgement at that point could have resulted in flattened fingers, but in those days health & safety was not so paramount and common sense was perhaps unduly relied upon. Inside the cafe, for a few pence, one could indulge in a cup of hot chocolate and a Wagon Wheel. Those circles of biscuity confectionary were at the time a recent invention and, I am certain, were much, much larger than they are now! They were the ultimate delight and a wonderful finale to the afternoon's trip out.

Visits to the Grange Lido were not confined to school expeditions. For many years through secondary school age, summer holidays would not have been the same without regular train trips across the estuary, usually accompanied by a parent or two, to that water wonderland at Grange. On a sunny day it would be packed out with local families sitting on the terraces – many there for the day – with beach- blankets, towels, flasks and picnics. As much time was spent on those terraces sun-bathing, snoozing, and running around as was spent in the water. Screams of childish delight and shouts of parental censure pervaded the air. We would look and wait with bated breath as some brave person climbed the steps up to the top diving-board and teetered for some time on the edge before descending in a graceful dive, a belly-flop or bomb-drop. I dread to think what might have happened if someone below had strayed into the impact area as the diver/jumper descended! But, as I have already mentioned, health and safety was not top of the agenda in those days, and I never heard of anyone getting injured.




