

A LETTER FROM VICSEKASI

I wonder what is blooming in your garden or in the scenery surrounding where you live? At present my garden is full of daffodils flowering, tulips about to flower and bluebells preparing themselves to flower. When I was a youth worker in Ulverston I remember we did some outside youth group sessions. In early April we went into the woods and spent time noticing the leaves, the seeds and how little colour there was. We went back to the same woods in early May and the floor was covered in bluebells. It was magnificent and an experience that I will never forget. Spring is a season that speaks of hope and new life.



I have been reflecting on these verses from Isaiah 43.18-19 as I go into April, 'Forget the former things; do not dwell on the past. See, I am doing a new thing! Now it springs up; do you not perceive it? I am making a way in the wilderness and streams in the wasteland.' Isaiah often spoke in pictures and poetry. He aimed to help people escape from the usual ways of thinking, and to imagine that things could – and would – be different in the future. When this passage was written God's people were living in exile, in Babylon, struggling to maintain their identity in a society which did not share their faith. God invited them through Isaiah's words to imagine a future which would be radically different from their present reality. As we have just acknowledged two years of lockdown, we can easily dwell on the losses we have experienced without perceiving the new thing God is doing. As we live in a new normal, what new thing is God doing?

As I write this, we are surrounded by images and news of the Ukrainian war, and it is devastating! We have been thinking and praying about how we can respond as a church to the refugee crisis. I have been challenged as we respond to the refugee crisis, what new thing is God doing? Where is he making ways in the wilderness and making streams in the desert?

On Palm Sunday we will remember Jesus' triumphant entry into Jerusalem. God was doing a new thing, but the people of God did not perceive it. One day they praised him shouting, 'Hosanna!' and some days later they shouted 'Take Him Away! Crucify Him!' As we journey through Easter it is a time for us to remember together his death and resurrection, when God did a new thing and brought new life to the world. Beyond the pain of the cross lies the hope of the resurrection. Let us not forget the new things God did and is doing and how he will make a way in the wilderness and make streams in the desert. As I close, I'm reminded of a lyric from a song by Don Moen, 'God will make a way where there seems to be no way'.

What new thing is God doing? What is springing up around us? What new way is God making?

Dietrich Bonhoeffer

The Common Worship Calendar commemorates Dietrich Bonhoeffer on 9 April, providing 'Lutheran Pastor, Martyr, 1945' as additional information. This is the day when he was hanged by the Nazis at Flossenbürg concentration camp, accused of association with the 20 July Plot on Hitler's life. It is recorded that, as he was led away, he said to a fellow-prisoner, 'This is the end - for me the beginning of life'.

Bonhoeffer was born in 1906, and was ordained into the Lutheran church in November 1931. He was a determined opponent of the Nazis from the time of the election campaign of 1933, which led to Hitler becoming Chancellor. He fought hard against Hitler's euthanasia programme and the persecution and genocide of the Jews, and was one of the notable church leaders who resisted Hitler's attempt to create a Nazified German Protestant Church. This involved the dismissal of pastors and other officials who were of lewish descent, and even the removal of the Old Testament from the Bible. The Christian opposition issued various declarations against this, asserting the Bible's integrity, God's fidelity to the Jews as his chosen people, and the power of baptism, regardless of racial or ethnic descent. One of the earliest of these declarations was the Bethel Confession of 1933, which Bonhoeffer played a leading part in drafting. But it was then watered down, and Bonhoeffer refused to sign it. He felt unable to accept a parish post in Berlin offered to him that autumn, and instead decided to withdraw by taking a two-year post as pastor of two German-speaking Protestant churches in London. Further oppositional declarations were issued in Germany, most notably the Barmen Declaration in 1934, and so, when Bonhoeffer's appointment in London ended, he returned to Germany and became a leading figure in what had by then evolved into being the Confessing Church, the name given to those who resisted the Nazi distortion.

Bonheoffer had started his ecclesiastical career as a high-flying academic, beginning with studies in the renowned theological faculty in Tübingen. He went on to gain a doctorate in Berlin, followed by further postgraduate work and a teaching fellowship at the Union Theological Seminary in New York. Now, in support of the Confessing Church, he travelled around eastern Germany running underground seminaries. But he was pursued by the Nazis, who closed successive seminaries and banned him from Berlin. In February 1938 Bonhoeffer made initial contact with the members of the German Resistance when his brother-in-law, Hans von Dohnányi (father of the celebrated musical conductor) introduced him to a group in Military Intelligence who were seeking Hitler's overthrow. In June 1939, however, Bonhoeffer accepted an invitation to return to the Union Theological Seminary in New York - a move he instantly regretted because of what was happening in Germany, and so he returned home only two weeks later. He had to report regularly to the police and was forbidden to publish anything or speak in public, but under the pretext of working for Military Intelligence, he travelled extensively, using his ecumenical connections abroad to make high-level contact with the Allies. With Dohnányi he was also involved in helping German Jews escape to Switzerland. Bonhoeffer and Dohnányi were both arrested on 5 April 1943. Bonhoeffer's practical actions were underpinned by his publications, most notably The Cost of Discipleship (on the Sermon on the Mount), Ethics (unfinished when he was arrested in 1943) and perhaps best known of all - his Letters and Papers from Prison, which were published after his death.

Gradually the sense of Easter and resurrection approaching grows stronger and the service climaxes with the lighting of the Easter Fire, outside the church, from which the Easter Candle is lit and processed back into the church where we proclaim the Resurrection. This special service is hosted at Cartmel Fell church but is designed for residents of all our villages to attend ... Why not come along and make Easter that bit more special this year?

Sex in the Church

I hoped the headline would spike your interest

In November 2020 the Church of England published resources intended to consult and discern a way forward for the Church on matters concerning identity, sexuality, relationships and marriage, entitled 'Living in Love and Faith'(LLF).

In January and February, a number of people from the Two Valleys attended a five-week course in Kendal designed to educate and open up discussion on these matters. It was both enlightening and thought provoking as we heard real life stories of people who, whilst having a strong Christian faith, have been prevented from celebrating aspects of their sexuality and relationships and have felt hurt by attitudes and practices of the Church. The course gave time for all participants to listen to different views on these topics and to discuss and learn together in a spirit of openness and acceptance.

The Bishops of the Church of England are inviting worshipping communities to feedback their thoughts and what they have learnt from engaging with the LLF resources and listening to others with their different perspectives. Feedback is welcomed by 30th April 2022 so that the Church of England can consider matters fully and make decisions during the rest of 2022 and 2023.

WITHERSLACK

A Note from the Parochial Church Council on our Churchyard:

Our Churchyard is a special place which commemorates those no longer with us on earth. We try our best to keep the Churchyard looking respectful and dignified, but we need your help in this.

Churchyards are holy spaces uniquely important in many ways: family links, history, architecture, wildlife and natural beauty. The Church has a duty to ensure that the character of the churchyard does not detract from the character of the church or other monuments.

Flowers:

Because they become bedraggled, <u>artificial flowers are not permitted</u>, except Christmas wreaths, and poppies at Remembrance, which should be removed afterwards. Glass vases are discouraged as they can break and cause injuries. It may be possible to plant bulbs, but not larger plants like trees or shrubs.

Please help by removing dead flowers. We would discourage the leaving of toys, photos or other such items by the grave where the weather ruins them and they can become unsightly, and also cause problems for grass cutting.

Containers:

We would encourage you to limit the number of flower containers on graves – ideally only one per grave. This enables easy grass cutting and maintenance of the Churchyard and prevents too many containers being blown around by the strong winds we often get these days.

Now that restrictions have lifted, I have booked tickets for some live events over the next few months, but I'm still a little worried. I can't quite believe things are fully back to

normal. What will happen if restrictions come back in?

It's understandable to be feeling apprehensive when there's been so much change, and knowing your rights will help you deal with anything unexpected. If you've got tickets to an event which goes ahead, but you change your mind about going or realise you're no longer able to go, you have no legal right to a refund. However, if the event is cancelled, your right to a refund will depend on how you bought the ticket.

If you booked through an official seller and the organiser cancels, moves, reschedules, or makes the event behind closed doors, you should get a refund. This is true even if it's cancelled due to a government ban on large events. If this happens, contact the official seller to find out how you can get a refund. If you bought your ticket from a ticket-reselling website, your refund will depend on the site's terms and conditions. If you're worried about the event being cancelled it's a good idea to look at the terms and conditions before booking.

If you bought from a private seller, unfortunately it's unlikely you'll be able to recover your money, even if the event is cancelled or rescheduled. We recommend contacting the seller to see what they can do. Ahead of any events you've booked, keep checking the information from the official seller or organiser to make sure you know straight away about any updates, like changes to the date or cancellations.

Another thing to be aware of is that scammers exploit these situations for their own benefit. If your event is cancelled and anyone - whether it's a person or a company - offers their services to try to recover money on your behalf, be suspicious. Make sure that you're aware of the signs of a potential scam and always be on the lookout. If you need more information on how to get a refund, take a look at the Citizens Advice website.

FURTHER SNIPPETS OF LOCAL HISTORY

I continue my excerpts from the writings of the late Frances Adams of Underbarrow whose forbears and relatives lived and worked in the Lyth Valley in the early to middle part of the twentieth century; here with some paragraphs about the damson orchards

"My cousin Susannah married Edward Inman of Draw Well, on the Howe, another hamlet like Rowe, on the side of Whitbarrow, overlooking the Lyth Valley. This tiny farm was the homestead of the Inman family for about 300 years, as tenants for generations and latterly as owners; and only passed from their possession in the 1960s. It was farmed by Edward's younger brother, Jim, a bearded patriarchal figure well known in the valley and much photographed by the Westmorland Gazette. He was inordinately proud of his orchards, though they were, in truth, fine, well-kept damson orchards.

There are still beautiful orchards in Lyth, regular and well-pruned; and in April the valley foams with blossoms and coachloads come to admire. Once the fruit was sold for dye, for the cotton and wool trades of Lancashire and Yorkshire. This came to an end about the time of the 1914-18 war; and between the wars the bulk of the fruit went to jam manufacturers. They would come round before the fruit was ripe and order hundreds of "scores" – the 20lb unit in which they were sold, and still are. Sometimes the buyers would offer a price for the whole orchard. The picking would start, and in a good year all possible casual help would be enlisted. There was a standard rate set for picking, perhaps three pence (old money) a score in a glut year. They were pleasant, sociable weeks, those weeks of the damson harvest. "It used to be like a holiday" an old lady reminisced to me recently. "My husband would be up the ladder and I picked from the ground; and we only came indoors to make something to eat."

As well as wholesale purchasers, there was a Damson Fair in Kendal. Nowadays, much of the fruit is sold at the farm gate and a lot is taken by lorry to the wholesale markets in Manchester and Newcastle. Every farm has its hand-written notice "Damsons for Sale" at the gate; but hardly any casual pickers are employed and in an abundant season many are left on the trees to rot.

Damson trees are very "free" as they describe them in the Lyth Valley. That is, they break easily. There are countless stories of people falling out of damson trees and injuring themselves badly; killing themselves even. Uncle Jim's son, Jim, would tell of his neighbour, in about 1915, who fell out of a tree and broke his neck; and how he, Jim, was one of the coffin-bearers. "He was the first I ever carried; I've carried a good many since."

CROSTHWAITE AND LYTH

With the prospect of Storm Dudley and the President having been pinged, the Emergency Phone List was activated and 20 members joined via Zoom to listen to a fascinating talk by Martin Douglas on the benefits of the Heversham Award - the Enclosure Act which dealt with the Lyth Valley.

Martin put forward the point of view that unlike other areas the Lyth Valley benefited from the Heversham Award, because the valley was drained allowing the fertile soil which had been flooded for millennia to be enclosed and fertilized and the 20,000 acres became 800 allotments which were divided among 263 people . A tiny portion of each allotment was sold to provide the funding to drain and enclose the land. Westmorland also benefited by having smallholders or Statesman who owned their farms.

There was a ready market in Kendal for produce and 1820 to 1880 was a good time to live in Crosthwaite and Lyth. We also had the benefit of generous landowners who were involved in and cared for the community. The population was the same then as it is now! Hopefully we will return to the Hall for our next meeting.


