# A LETTER FROM SIMON HOWARD

I am writing this whilst sheltering from the heatwave. This summer's weather has been identified as further evidence of the Climate Emergency created by human activity. Although I don't agree with them, I do have sympathy with folk who deny that Climate Change is happening, or at least that humans are responsible for it. The implications of unchecked manmade climate change are terrifying. In the face of a potential catastrophe, which as individuals we seem powerless to prevent, it



is a very natural reaction to look away and get on with life as if nothing is happening.

Last year the Church of England nationally committed to being carbon neutral by 2030, an ambitious target. Regionally the churches of Cumbria have adopted 'Tread Gently' as one of their 4 vision statements to guide their work for the next 10 years. However, despite this, the church in many ways has come late to the ecological party, which is disappointing, for in the face of climate anxiety and fear Christian faith can be a great help.

It can spur us to join the community of those daring to believe that the actions we take, and we encourage others to take, can and will make a difference. Acting out of faith, in love, creates a hope filled future.

As we celebrate the fruits of creation this harvest time and give thanks for the skill and dedication of our farming community, let us also reflect again on the damage we have inflicted upon the earth. As part of our reflections and celebrations let us renew our commitment to the planet by identifying the next actions we can take, individually and as a community, to reduce our carbon footprint and to preserve and protect the gift of God's creation.

### St John Chrysostom

St John Chrysostom is one of the great saints of the Eastern Church commemorated in the Anglican calendar. His feast-day should be 14 September, the date of his death in 407. But this clashes with Holy Cross Day (a red-letter day), so his feast is celebrated on 13 September instead. He was renowned as a preacher: his sermons (over 700 of them) are scholarly in content and very vigorous in tone, and it is clear that he pulled no punches when tackling what he saw as the challenging issues of the day! It was his eloquence that quickly earned him the flattering nickname of 'Chrysostomos', meaning 'golden mouthed'. He wrote several treatises also, including one on the exalted nature of priesthood, another on the incomprehensibility of the Divine Nature and, alongside this, a book of Instructions to Catechumens, which has had a lasting influence on the catechism of the western church. But it is chiefly his influence on the liturgy that keeps his memory alive today. Even now the Orthodox and Eastern Catholic Churches of the Byzantine Rite use 'The Divine Liturgy of St John Chrysostom' as the normal Eucharistic liturgy. Modern experts debate Chrysostom's exact connection with this liturgy as it has come down the centuries, but the belief that he was the author gives this liturgy a special status and recognises his undoubted influence as a liturgist.

Surprisingly, perhaps, the Church of England has its own connection with him since it was his liturgy that Thomas Cranmer drew upon when he composed the Litany, as published in the original Book of Common Prayer of 1549. This Litany included a prayer believed to be by St John Chrysostom and, in the 1662 BCP (the one that endures to this day), this prayer was printed as one of the possible concluding prayers for Matins and Evensong. It's the familiar prayer that has in it the phrase 'that when two or three are gathered together in thy name, thou wilt grant their request'. Whether it really was written by John Chrysostom, we will never know, but it is rubricated in the BCP and in Common Worship as 'A Prayer of St Chrysostom'. Given his importance in the development of the Greek liturgy, I like the fact that, thanks to Cranmer, the Anglican tradition also has a liturgical connection with him, slender though it is.

St John was born c. 347 and was educated first in the law and then in theology at the great centre of learning in Antioch. He felt called to the monastic life and for a time lived as a hermit, when he began the extreme asceticism which permanently undermined his health. Bishop Flavian of Antioch ordained him deacon in 381 and priest in 386, appointing him to devote special attention to preaching. For the next twelve years he preached sermons on many of the biblical books, earning himself a reputation as an outstanding biblical interpreter and moralist and, as we have seen, the name 'golden mouthed'. Much against his wishes, in 398 he was made Patriarch of Constantinople, but once in post determinedly set about reform, presenting uncompromising moral challenges to other senior ecclesiastics and to the Empress Eudoxia. The enemies he made brought about his ruin. Following a packed trial, in 404 he was removed from his see. When this did not silence him, he was banished, first to Antioch and then to Pontus on the Black Sea. He was finally deliberately killed by enforced travelling on foot in bad weather.

We don't care if you are more Christian than the Archbishop of Canterbury, or haven't been to church since Christmas ten years ago. We extend a special welcome to those who are over sixty but not grown up yet, and to teenagers who are growing up too fast. We welcome keep-fit mums, football dads, starving Christian tree-huggers, latte sippers, vegetarians or junk food eaters. We welcome those who are in recovery or still addicted. We welcome you if you are having problems, are down in the dumps, or don't like organised religion (we are not that keen on it either). We offer a welcome to those who think the world is flat, work too hard, don't work at all, or are just here because granny is visiting and wanted to come to the church. We welcome those who are inked, pierced, both or neither. We offer a special welcome to those who could use a prayer right now, had religion shoved down their throats as kids, lost in the local countryside and wound up here by mistake.

The cost of energy and food is so high now. With the kids home from school for the summer, I'm having to pay more for Citizens Advice lunches and snacks. I'm worried about how I'll put food on the table. I'm on a prepayment meter and I'm really scared we're going to be left without any gas or electric if I can't top up. What can I do?

You're doing the right thing in reaching out for support and there are things you can get help with.

As a prepayment meter customer, your energy supplier will be able to give you temporary credit if you can't afford to top up your meter. They might add this to your meter automatically, but if they don't, you can call them and ask them to do this.

If you run out of temporary credit, speak to your supplier to explain your situation. They may give you extra temporary credit if you're struggling with living costs. There are other reasons why they might give you extra credit too, including if you're disabled, have a long-term health condition, or you have children under the age of 5. You'll have to pay back anything extra you get, but you can agree how to do this in a way you can afford with your supplier.

If you pay council tax and you're in bands A-D, you should get a payment of £150 automatically. It could take until the end of September, but if you've not had it already you might need to make a claim. You can check how to do this on your council's website.

You might also be able to get a fuel voucher, which you can use to add credit to your meter. Contact your local council about this.

There's more government support coming from October, including a £400 payment to help you with your energy bills. If you have a prepayment meter, you'll be given vouchers in the first week of each month from October, via SMS text, email or post. Make sure your energy company has your up-to-date details.

To help manage other costs, it's also worth checking you're getting all the benefits you're entitled to. There are benefits calculators you can use online. On the Citizens Advice website, there's advice on how to reduce living costs and information on other ways to increase your income.

The school holidays can be a really tough time. Contact your local council to find out what extra support you can get over the holidays. If you can't afford to buy food, your local Citizens Advice can help you get a referral for a food bank.

We know this is an extremely worrying time and everyone's situation is different. Don't struggle alone. If you need further support, contact your local Citizens Advice or call the national advice line: 0800 144 8848



She described for us how, over the years, after perceiving a need for fistula surgery in the country, she has developed the treatment provided from an annual camp - literally - where approximately 10 patients were operated on in a local schoolroom and post operative care was under canvas, to a purpose built unit with an operating theatre, 4 bed recovery room and pre and post operative care facilities.

This has necessitated a tremendous network of unpaid Health Facilitators finding the ladies with this unmentionable, but surgically repairable condition and encouraging them to go for treatment, often many days walk away.

The funding has come from many sources including the German government and a Kentmere based Trust and it was heart warming to hear that the work of the Unit is expanding throughout the Province, and that maternity services in Nepal are free.

And then we are off to Saltaire as guests of our old friends Bingley W.I. whom we haven't seen since pre-Covid days.

#### UNDERBARROW

The ladies of Underbarrow WI have celebrated 100 years since they were founded in October 1922. The Centenary Garden Party was hosted by Mr and Mrs Brian and Hilary Crowe at Middle Blakebank.
