A LETTER FROM SIMON HOWARD



Hello.

Imagine the scene. You are standing secure on a rocky mountain looking out, whilst all around you the clouds swirl about driven by an ever-changing wind. Sometimes they bring showers of rain, occasionally they part to offer views of the valleys round about you, but you stand secure in the midst of it.

This might be the scene you enter on top of a Lakeland fell in February, or in any other month come to that! But it is also the image that has been offered to me from

two different directions as I have navigated my way through life over the past year.

The first person to offer it was the counsellor I was working with helping me to process my thoughts and feelings after a period of multiple change and loss. The invitation was to see our thoughts and feelings as the weather swirling round the mountain. They affect us, indeed at times they can overwhelm us, but they are not who we are. We are separate from them, standing on the mountain. He suggested the Mindfulness R.A.I.N. Process as a useful, kind, way of responding to the stormy weather of our thoughts and feelings.


The second person who offered this image was the Augustinian monk, priest and teacher Martin Laird in his book 'Into the Silent land'. The book is designed to help people explore silent prayer, simply being in the presence of God with no agenda or requests. The hardest thing about sitting still in silence is that the mind keeps on spinning off in all sorts of directions. All these thoughts and feeling he says, are like the weather swirling round a mountain. The art of silent, contemplative prayer is to recognise when we have become caught up in the weather and then gently return to the reality that actually we are standing on the mountain, which is God, and his great love for us.

I found Identifying God as the mountain on which we stand really helpful. For if God and his love for us and for all of creation, is where each of us stands, if it is the landscape in which we lead our lives, then whatever storms assail us we stand secure. For, as Lent prepares us to celebrate, this is the God whose love has conquered even death for us. In the deepest sense therefore 'It's OK", or as Sister Julian of Norwich put it much more poetically, "All shall be well, and all manner of things shall be well."

And if God really is the mountain on which we stand that quotation changes from mere optimism, that in the future the weather, the economy, the political situation,

will get better, into real hope. For if we know that God holds us in his love today, then we can trust that he will also fulfil his promises in the future in a way that leads to true freedom for each one of us. When we have that kind of hope we can dare to live more fully in the present moment knowing that all of life is in good hands.

May you enjoy adventures on the mountains month, whatever the weather.

Whatever our church denomination, we often use the same Sunday Gospel from the Revised Common Lectionary. During the first five Sundays of Lent, four of the Gospels are curiously from John's Gospel. By basing each of the five sessions in this course on the previous Sunday's Gospel, David Wilbourne provides a brilliant connection to the preaching and teaching that has just taken place. Serious yet full of life and humour, the course covers:

Monday 27 February - Session 1: Temptation . . . On checking every word that comes out of the mouth of God. Matthew 4:1-11

Monday 6 March - Session 2: Strangers in the night . . . Nicodemus came to Jesus under cover of darkness: finding God in surprising places. John 3:1-17

Monday 13 March - Session 3: The winner takes it all 'You worship what you do not know': upping our game with worship. John 4:5-42

Monday 20 March - Session 4: I was blind but now I see. John 9

Monday 27 March - Session 5: Them bones, them bones, them dry bones, hear the word of the Lord! Contrasting events in John with parables in the Synoptics. John 11:1-45

The course booklet is accompanied by a lively CD, in which David Wilbourne and guests from various denominational backgrounds, put forward their thoughts on the themes of the course.

On each Monday we will hold <u>a session at 2.00pm in the Vicarage at Crosthwaite</u> and will repeat the session <u>on the same day on Zoom in the evening at 7.30pm</u>.

As the weather has turned colder, I've noticed black mould and damp in our flat. Our letting agency said they would speak to our landlord, but nothing has happened. I'm really worried about how

this might affect our health. Our tenancy agreement isn't up for eight months, what can I do?

Unfortunately, it isn't always easy to work out the cause of mould or damp. This can make it difficult to work out if your landlord is responsible. The most common causes are rising, penetrating, construction and condensation damp. On our website there is information that may help you work out what type of damp you have, who is responsible and what you can do. Check your tenancy agreement too for mentions of repairs and damp. <a href="https://www.citizensadvice.org.uk/housing/renting-privately/during-your-tenancy/dealing-with-repairs/">https://www.citizensadvice.org.uk/housing/renting-privately/during-your-tenancy/dealing-with-repairs/</a>

A landlord will have to act in relation to damp if it makes the property unsafe for someone to live in, e.g. if it is making them ill. The landlord will also be responsible if the damp is related to repairs they should have carried out, like if heaters are broken.

One of the most common causes of damp is condensation. To prevent this, it's important to keep homes well-heated and well-ventilated, but this is expensive. You may be eligible for help to insulate and heat your home.

If your landlord is responsible for the damp in your property but doesn't act, you can report them to the local authority. If you're in social housing you might also be able to use the landlord's formal complaints procedure. Visit our website to find out more. If it reaches the point where you want to get out of a fixed term tenancy agreement early, do speak to an adviser first. 

#### **UNDERBARROW**


