

A LETTER FROM HILARY FITCH

Who is the apple of your eye? Are you at your wit's end or have you escaped something by the skin of your teeth?

There are many such idioms and figures of speech that we use that have their origins in the Bible. The Christian Bible comprises the Old and New Testaments and the earliest writings are thought to be from around 1500 BC with the New Testament book being completed by 100 AD, about 67 years after Jesus' death on the cross. The Bible is the most read book in the world and all experiences of human life are there, so it is not surprising that our language is rich in the imagery of the Bible. The first complete translation of the Bible into English was by John Wycliffe and his followers in 1382 but it was not until the Protestant Reformation in the sixteenth century and the use of printing presses, that the Bible in various translations became more widely available for ordinary people to read. Since then, Biblical sayings have become part of our language.



Proverbs 7:2 says "Keep my commands and you will live; guard my teachings as the apple of your eye".

Psalm 107:26 describes the actions and fear of some sailors who are terrified when caught in a storm: "They reeled and staggered like drunken men; they were at their wits' end".

Job 19:20. Job says "I am nothing but skin and bones; I have escaped by only the skin of my teeth". He is lamenting all that has happened to him. He has a horrible disfiguring illness; his friends are unsympathetic and even his wife shuns him. He is just clinging on by the narrowest margin.

These examples are from the Old Testament but there are expressions from the New Testament that have also entered our language. Having a millstone round your neck comes from Luke 17:2 and a wolf in sheep's clothing is based on Matthew 7:15.

There are many more examples and although it is interesting to find them out, what strikes me is the detailed knowledge people of old must have had of their Bibles. They must have spent many hours reading and treasuring what they found for so many Biblical expressions to have entered the language.

Today, reading the Bible is often seen as something difficult and perhaps even boring but reading the Scriptures is important. The writings in the Bible are God-inspired and reveal his nature. They tell the over-arching story from creation, through God's relationship with his chosen people, the Jewish nation, until the coming of Jesus and through him God's revelation to the peoples of the whole world. It is not an instruction manual telling us what to do in every situation but it teaches us how to think as we deal with issues that we find in the world today. So, reading the Bible is well-worth the effort!

Modern translations of the Bible are clear and in straightforward language and study Bibles have footnotes which offer more information. There are useful websites such as

the Bible Gateway (BibleGateway.com) where you can look up passages or phrases which you may know but not be sure about where they appear and you can easily switch between translations. The Bible Society offers The Bible Course (www.biblesociety.org.uk/explore-the-bible/the-bible-course/) which can be done as a group or with a personal edition. This gives a really good overview of the structure of the Bible with all its different books and styles of writing. You do have to pay for this but it is only £9.99 for the personal edition, with eight sessions that you can access whenever you like to fit in with your lifestyle. Alternatively, as we are now in Lent, you may choose to focus on one book of the Bible and read a chapter or two each day and it's still not too late to join the Two Valleys Lent Groups!

Whatever our church denomination, we often use the same Sunday Gospel from the Revised Common Lectionary. During the first five Sundays of Lent, four of the Gospels are curiously from John's Gospel. By basing each of the five sessions in this course on the previous Sunday's Gospel, David Wilbourne provides a brilliant connection to the preaching and teaching that has just taken place. Serious yet full of life and humour, the course covers:

Monday 27 February - Session 1: Temptation . . . On checking every word that comes out of the mouth of God. Matthew 4:1-11

Monday 6 March - Session 2: Strangers in the night . . . Nicodemus came to Jesus under cover of darkness: finding God in surprising places. John 3:I-I7

Monday 13 March - Session 3: The winner takes it all 'You worship what you do not know': upping our game with worship. John 4:5-42

Monday 20 March - Session 4: I was blind but now I see. John 9

Monday 27 March - Session 5: Them bones, them bones, them dry bones, hear the word of the Lord! Contrasting events in John with parables in the Synoptics. John 11:1-45

The course booklet is accompanied by a lively CD, in which David Wilbourne and guests from various denominational backgrounds, put forward their thoughts on the themes of the course.

On each Monday we will hold a session at 2.00pm in the Vicarage at Crosthwaite and will repeat the session on the same day on Zoom in the evening at 7.30pm.

I've been offered a new job. The new company wants me to start as soon as possible but we're really short-staffed where I am now and I don't know how soon I'll be allowed to leave. How should I bring all this up with my boss?

There are set rules about notice periods. First check your contract, if you have one. If you've been in your current job for less than one month, you won't have to give any notice, unless your contract says otherwise. If you don't have a contract, and your employer has no written record of you agreeing to a notice period, but you have been employed for more than a month, you have to give at least one week's notice.

Fixed-term contracts are a bit different, as you won't need to give notice if you intend to leave on the last day of your contract. Leaving before the end of a fixed-term contract usually means giving at least one week's notice, but again check your contract to see if this is different.

Although it may be tempting to hand in your resignation as soon as possible, it's worth waiting until your new employer has confirmed your new employment, for example by signing your contract or by giving you a start date.

It's then best to give your resignation in writing (email is fine), so that you have a record of the date you told your employer. You can find guidance on how to do this on the Citizens Advice website, where we have a page on handing in your notice.

Don't forget about your holiday days during your notice period. If you have any unused annual leave, speak to your employer about either taking these during the notice period or being paid back for them in your final salary payment.

Finally, sometimes people can change their mind about moving jobs or find their circumstances alter. If this happens to you, you should speak to your current employer to see what your options are and if you can stay in your current role.




