

This is a wonderfully atmospheric service as we sit in darkness, lit only by candlelight, and listen to some of the most well-known stories from the Old Testament telling the story of Salvation ... Gradually the sense of Easter and resurrection approaching grows stronger and the service climaxes with the lighting of the Easter Fire, outside the church, from which the Easter Candle is lit and processed back into the church where we proclaim the Resurrection. THE LANDOWNERS OF CROSTHWAITE AND LYTH MANAGEMENT OF THE HIGH ALLOTMENT

The High Allotment on the northern end of Whitbarrow is owned by The Landowners of Crosthwaite and Lyth for the community and has recently come within a Countryside Stewardship grant scheme for management as Wood Pasture. Visually this will bring little change and will enhance the special environmental nature of the

approximately 30 acres. There will be scrub clearance (volunteers always welcome), selective planting of clumps of native trees and improvement of the flora by selective and intermittent conservation grazing by heritage cattle.

Whitbarrow Road, which runs around the edge of the land, is a byway open to all traffic (BOAT) and as such is attractive to motorcycle trail riders and 4x4 vehicles which should comply with all required legislation for use. Unfortunately these users occasionally stray from the track without any permissions and cause long lasting damage to the sensitive and nationally important habitat. We therefore intend to fence the track off with a post and two or three strand wire fence which will have the benefit of containing any grazing animals on the land side and vehicular users on the track side. This will additionally prevent funnelling of cattle into the narrow enclosed track running round to the lime kiln making for safer pedestrian and vehicular use of the track.

Rest assured that we are not intending the restriction of pedestrian access to the Allotment and on through the gate in the wall to Township Allotment and Whitbarrow summit. This is a facility well-used by locals. A Permissive Path along the line of the existing trod up the rock steps from the track heading in a straight line up the slope to the gate will be created which will be clearly open to all walkers. There will be three kissing gate access points through the new fence: the first near the gate on the track from The Row, the second further along on the level and the third at the existing trod up the rock step near the footpath passing The High. A locked vehicular gate to allow maintenance vehicles access will also be installed near the middle kissing gate.

I will be at The Derby Arms again from I2noon until 2.00pm on Wednesday 26th April. Happy to have a chat with anyone about anything really.....



I ordered a watch online with personalised engraving for my partner's upcoming 40th birthday. The company has since gone out of business. I keep phoning and emailing them but can't get through to anyone. I can't afford to buy another gift until I get my money back. Please can you help?

If the company has gone into administration, it may still be able to fulfil outstanding orders, but if it is already in liquidation, you'll need to try to get your money back. If you're unsure about what state the company is in, the Citizens Advice website has information on how to find out.

Is there a shop or office you can visit, to get an update on your order, or request a refund? If that isn't possible, the next steps depend on whether it's a limited company (it will have ltd or plc after its title) or if it's a sole trader (someone who runs their own business) or partnership.

If it's a limited company, you'll need to get details of the administrator or receiver the person dealing with settling the trader's debts. The names of those administrators will usually be on the website of the company that's gone bust. You should register your claim as a creditor on the GOV.UK website. Fill out the form with details of what you're owed and send it to the administrator.

Unfortunately, there's only a small chance you'll receive any money back because you'll be last in a long list of creditors who need to be paid.

If you paid by debit or credit card, you could also try getting your money back with a Section 75 claim or a chargeback claim to your card provider or bank. Full details about both these types of claims can be found on the Citizens Advice website.

If the seller was a sole trader or partnership and not a limited company, pursuing a Section 75 or chargeback claim is your best option.

The Stations of the Cross

Easter Day is on 9 April this year, and so the long preparatory penitential season of Lent began on 22 February with Ash Wednesday. As we get closer to Easter and enter Passiontide on the fifth Sunday in Lent, known as Passion Sunday, the intensity increases; and on the following Sunday, which is Palm Sunday, we begin Holy Week, the most solemn period of the church's year. On Palm Sunday itself we celebrate Christ's Entry into Jerusalem. But we know what is about to come: the Last Supper, Betrayal, Trial, Crucifixion and Burial, which we commemorate on Maundy Thursday, Good Friday and Holy Saturday. Then, at last, following all our meditation on suffering and sacrifice and our lengthy period of penitence and self-denial throughout Lent, we come to Easter Sunday, with its joyous celebration of the Resurrection.

One of the devotional practices associated with Passiontide is that of processing around the church and meditating on stages in Christ's progress from the moment of his condemnation by Pilate to his body being taken down from the cross and laid in the tomb. Pilgrims to Jerusalem, from at least as early as the fourth century, followed the traditional route from the site of the condemnation to the site of Calvary, reflecting on the significance of it all and spiritually sharing in Christ's suffering. The route quickly became known as the Via Dolorosa, the Sorrowful Way (more commonly translated as the Way of Suffering, or the Way of Sorrows), and it is still the focus of pilgrimage today.

A millennium later, in the fourteenth century, it was realised that this pilgrimage could be spiritually re-enacted within the local church. This devotional 'reliving', which probably came about under the influence of the Franciscans, was instantly popular. To give focus to the practice within the church, removed as it was from the historical sites themselves, progress was organised into stages or stations: moments of pause and focussed reflection on particular episodes in Christ's experiences from Condemnation to Burial. Most of the details which provided the focus for these successive stages or stations of mediation and prayer were drawn from the four gospels, but some were legendary elaborations, such as the story of how St Veronica wiped Christ's sweating face with a cloth, on which was left a miraculous imprint of his visage. It became increasingly common for each pause-point to be marked by an image of the episode to be meditated upon, and these are known Stations of the Cross. In England the Reformation swept away devotional practices such as this, together with the associated images. But as the Church of England developed a High Church tradition in the nineteenth century, Stations of the Cross and the devotional practice of which they were a part were reintroduced within that tradition. Their use gradually spread rather more widely, although there are very many Anglican churches in which the Stations are not found. Of course, the Roman Catholic church did not break with the medieval practice, and so Stations of the Cross are to be found in all their churches.

Nowadays, at least within the Roman Catholic tradition, there are customarily fourteen Stations, although the number and sequence of episodes was not finally settled until the 18th-19th centuries. The Stations themselves may be indicated around the walls of the church by pictures or icons, carvings, or just numbers, sometimes with a brief sentence alongside to signal the episode in question.

He told us about the varied events with which the team had been involved. They are often life savers when people have become stuck in the treacherous sands around the Bay. The team have a great variety of different vehicles so are called to help at times of flood and, occasionally, during snow storms where their tracked vehicles can come into their own.

As less than 20% of its funding comes from the N.H.S. 


