

A LETTER FROM DOROTHY GRACE

Dear friends.

As I write this at the beginning of June, I suspect that the long spell of warm sunny weather is coming to an end. We do need the rain, so I suppose we can't complain! One exception to the sunshine was the whole North Sea coast, where it remained cool and overcast. We've just returned from Aberdeenshire, and can vouch for the lack of sunshine and lower temperatures!



While there, we spent some time visiting historic sites: stone circles, inscribed stones and a few castles. The stone circles, like those everywhere, are something of an enigma, with no one knowing for certain what they were for, why they were built and what activities or ceremonies took place there all those years ago.

Some 10% of all the stone circles in Britain occur in Aberdeenshire, giving us plenty to visit! Those in Aberdeenshire have a characteristic structure not found elsewhere; they date from the Bronze Age and are thought to be linked to extended lunar cycles. But whatever their purpose, these stone circles obviously had meaning and significance to the lives of the builders: something beyond day-to-day human existence; something to facilitate connection with or reverence for something 'other'. They were all built with great care, and to a similar pattern and orientation, bringing communities together through the amount of effort needed to source, shift and place all the large stones.

In a few of the circles, the much later Pictish people had inscribed their own patterns and symbols on some of the larger stones. They also placed large inscribed stones in particular places in the landscape – places that had special meaning to them. Again, no one knows why, or what the characteristic inscriptions and symbols actually mean, but perhaps they marked places where the people felt a particular closeness to the 'other' that they were seeking.

Within Christianity, particularly in the Celtic tradition, people refer to 'thin places', where they feel a particular closeness to God. This may be a place

of regular worship, or a historic site related to one of the earlier Celtic saints. Our local churches, which have been sites of regular worship and prayer for many generations, have become thin places, somewhere where God is particularly present and accessible. We may also sense a 'thinness' when we visit a place of Christian worship elsewhere. Perhaps we have a personal thin place, up a fell or in a beautiful garden: there is something about the feel of the place and what we can see that speaks of God's presence, that draws us to Him.

And just as the stone circles speak of community, our churches are places where our community gathers to worship and pray together. There is something about meeting to worship with others that is different from and complementary to praying individually; corporate worship is uplifting as we sing and pray together - perhaps this is what the ancient pre-Christian communities felt as they gathered among the stones. Jesus says that when two or three gather in His name, He is there with them. So I do encourage everyone to experience this gathering to worship, whether in Sunday services, Messy Church, Café Church, a house group or Refresh. All these are very different experiences of meeting to worship God and pray together, so there is hopefully something to suit everyone - why not give one a try? You will be very welcome!

CALLING ALL PARISHIONERS

Fidei Defensor: Defender of the Faith July 2023

The King's Christian coronation oaths generated a good deal of comment. I touched on the origins of the main ones in my May article on the history of the Coronation, but did not then have room to say anything about his title Fidei Defensor, 'Defender of the Faith'. So I deal with that now.

It was created in 1521 as an award by Pope Leo X to Henry VIII in acknowledgement of the support Henry had given, as a good Catholic, to the Church of Rome against Martin Luther. In 1520 Luther had published three reformist works, one of which argued that there were only two sacraments - Baptism and Eucharist — rather than the seven recognised by Rome. Leo X immediately issued a pronouncement that these writings were heretical and must be destroyed. Luther refused to recant and publicly burnt a copy of the Pope's pronouncement, with the predictable result that he was excommunicated. The threat of religious divisions in Europe escalated alarmingly. Henry joined the fray in 1521 by issuing, in his own name, a rebuttal of Luther's arguments: Assertio Septem Sacramentorum (Defence of the Seven Sacraments). The well-educated Henry was capable of writing scholarly material in Latin, but in this he had been prompted by John Fisher, Bishop of Rochester, and the work was ghost-written by a team of theologians. It upheld the Catholic view of the sacraments and papal supremacy and was the reason why Pope Leo (after some persuasion from Henry) awarded him the papal title: Fidei Defensor. The parents of Henry's wife, Catherine of Aragon, had previously been awarded the papal title of 'Catholic Monarchs' because of their defeat of the last Islamic power in Spain. So Henry was keen to have a papal title too; and now he had one.

When, in 1530, Henry broke with Rome and established himself as Head of the Church in England, the title was revoked by the Pope (by then, Paul III) since this act was regarded as an attack on 'the faith' (i.e. the faith of the Church of Rome), and Henry was excommunicated. In 1544, however, when the new religious settlement in England was being consolidated, Parliament formally recognised Fidei Defensor as an official title of the Sovereign, and so it has remained, apart from the brief period of Cromwell's Protectorate.

It is ironic that a title conferred by the Pope to signal Henry's anti-reformation credentials was subsequently reassigned by Parliament to signal his stance against Catholicism. What we have to remember, however, is that reformers commonly explained their position as a restoration of the true faith, the understanding and practice of which had become corrupted over time. The reinstated title reclaimed Henry's position as Defender of the (true) Faith. This was precisely the signification of the original papal award — except that in the interim the understanding of what the true faith was had been redefined in reformist circles and Henry had changed sides. Even so, in England the redefinition/reformation under Henry was not as radical in terms of observance or organisation as it was in many other Protestant lands, and the Parliamentary confirmation of Fidei Defensor can be seen as a propaganda move to underline what Henry claimed to be the defining characteristic of his reform: an essential continuity with the true version of the faith of old, of which he was properly the defender.

The title's abbreviation on coins was Fid Def, but became FD on those of Elizabeth II and will remain so for Charles III.



Potatoes

The inventory of William Redhead of Sanderson Fold, made in December 1710, shows he grew potatoes. This is the earliest mention of them in Crosthwaite and Lyth. According to "Manners and Customs of Westmorland, 1827, the first potatoes were sold in Kendal in 1730 by 'Potato' Morsden of Kirkby Lonsdale. possible that Redhead attended Kendal market to sell his apples and also potatoes earlier than Morsden. In the nineteenth century many farmers and smallholders sold produce in Kendal market from the Lyth Valley area - vegetables, fruit, potatoes and pigs (in crates) - in the street markets. Butter, dressed poultry and eggs were sold in the market hall from 1865. The market was free, the tolls having been bought out by the Kendal Farmers Club - the forerunner to the NFU. All the local parishes made their contribution to the purchase. The present market hall, built in 1888, replaced a purpose built market hall funded by the agricultural community in 1855, and when replaced it became Kendal's first public library (the facades were rebuilt and remain in Sandes Avenue). SLDC decided in 1978 to end the free market and acquire complete control, no compensation being offered to the purchasers of the tolls. However, Michael Jopling MP (now Lord Jopling) insisted provision be made for the free space in the market hall for local people. SLDC duly amended their market bill which was contested in the House of Lords. One of the petitioners, Robin Bagot, objected to the wording of the amendment and the Lords committee altered the wording. They also allowed the sale of home made goods previously not sold in the market hall. The Kendal branch NFU, who also in the House of Commons petitioned for the free space to be extended to the outdoor Stramongate market, drew attention to the loose wording of the Lords amendment. The House of Commons committee made no changes.

Consequently the current team of lawyers employed by SLDC now Westmorland and Furness have decided not to give the free space to anyone. It is surprising how this right has been casually shelved by the elected councillors of the area, considering they have powers of discretion to preserve the free market and retain their honour.

Curlew Recovery South Lakes

"That noise, it's part of Spring and part of all our childhoods, and we want to retain that." So said George Taylor of Crook, talking to BBC Radio Cumbria last month about his involvement in the work of Curlew Recovery South Lakes. Along with all the farmers with nests on their land, George has been terrific in helping the curlews.

Curlews nest on the ground, and are vulnerable to predation from foxes, badgers, and crows. The local curlew volunteers use electric fences with the permission of the farmers to protect nests and avoid losses during agricultural operations.



At the time of writing (mid-June), the volunteers have found 18 nests. Sadly, five nests were lost to predation before fencing. The volunteers are now making daily checks on 8 broods of chicks. We're sad to report that 4 clutches of chicks seem to have been lost. We often watch the adult birds defending against crows. Ground nesting birds need the support of predator control, but capturing the rogue crows this late in the season is likely to be challenging.

Sadly, one nest failed to hatch despite the birds incubating for an extended period. Sheffield University's analysis revealed that the eggs were nearly fully developed, leaving us with an unsolved mystery.

Curlews are a wonderful part of our local landscape, yet their breeding success is extremely poor across lowland areas. Every nest and every chick is vitally precious, and our volunteers are unwavering in their commitment to help secure the future of curlews as breeding birds in our valleys.

Her talk was very informative and eye-opening to the lengths to which criminals will go and how best to protect ourselves from these types of crimes.



I bought a car costing £3,325 via an online marketplace. I hadn't seen any negative reviews about the company so I just thought it was fine and transferred the money. But the car never arrived, and then I saw it re-advertised in different places. I tried to contact the company but

they've changed all their numbers and email addresses. What can I do?

Anyone can be targeted by a scam and sadly anyone can fall for one. Talk to your bank or card company immediately to see if you can stop or recover the payment. Report the scam to Action Fraud on 0300 123 204. You can also contact the Citizens Advice Consumer Service for help with what to do next.

Citizens Advice Consumer Service received over 9,000 reports of scams between January to April 2023. The charity is urging more people to report scams to help protect others from falling victim. As scammers get ever more sophisticated it's more important than ever that we all work together to raise awareness, report scams and share our experiences to help protect ourselves from their tricks.

The most common scams faced by the public so far this year are malicious parcel delivery messages with scammers attempting to get hold of personal information or bank details. Several of the most frequently encountered forms of scams involve quite sophisticated impersonation of official organisations.

It is important to keep alert to signs of a scam. These include offers that seem too good to be true, like a holiday that's much cheaper than you'd expect, or pressure to send money quickly, or in an unusual way – like by an iTunes voucher or a transfer service. Other clues are if you are asked to give away personal information such as passwords, PINs or verification codes - a reputable organisation will never ask for these things. Always step back and double check. If there is any hint that the organisation or person you are dealing with isn't genuine, such as a suspicious email address, don't part with any money or information.


