A LETTER FROM BRIAN CROWE

The news in recent weeks has revolved around fear, wherever you look.

In the US, Donald Trump's campaign is based on fear - that the US no longer retains its pre-eminent place in the world. The solutions offered are to build barriers to protect itself from the world:

- a wall to keep out Mexicans;
- the denial of visas to exclude Muslims;
- tariffs to exclude China's exports.

These arguments resonate well with those fearful of the future.

The Republican Party itself now admits fear in the face of Trump's success, worried about the consequences for the US.

In Europe, the continuing Migration crisis offers no end in sight. We understand the need for compassion in the face of refugees trying to survive as they escape from Syria, Iraq or Afghanistan, but we become fearful when we see the vast scale of the numbers of people on the move. As Justin Welby, the Archbishop of Canterbury, recently expressed, "it is reasonable and legitimate for people to fear Europe's 'Colossal Crisis' of migration".

And in Britain, the EU referendum debate has so far been distinguished, not by its expression of alternative visions of how our nation may take its place among others to build peace and a fair society within our world, but by drawing attention only to the fears of whether we remain or leave.

Meanwhile, most of us are probably much more focused on our own concerns – our individual health, the costs of our own care in the future, our children's job prospects, our grandchild's education, completing required repairs following the floods, the impending welfare cuts facing those living with a disability. What do we do with our fear? We somehow assume that we are in control of our own lives, but in fact we always have to trust others, whether the doctor in the NHS, the teacher in the classroom, the employer in the workplace, the politician for a fair tax and benefits system. That trust is difficult to give, particularly if we have frequently been disappointed by those we've trusted.

Fear has always been with us. But this Easter let's look at the fear faced by Jesus' followers and see Jesus' response to their fear. Peter, the leading disciple, in his fear of the authorities, repeatedly denied Jesus, yet was welcomed back by Jesus and restored to friendship and love. Mary Magdalene, terrified by the lack of Jesus' body in the tomb, received Jesus' reassurance – "Don't be afraid!" He is not here, He has risen, just as he said.".

This Easter, may you find yourself able to put your trust in One who will prove trustworthy, who loves us so much that he has been to the cross for us, and may he help us face our fear.

BIBLE Book of the Month LEVITICUS

Author: Traditionally Moses.

Date of composition: Most of the laws appear to have been codified when the Israelites camped in the Sinai region c.1275 BC, but later editing could have taken place. **Structure:** The book is in two parts, Chs 1-15 are laws of sacrifices and rituals, chs 17-27 cover mostly behavioural ethics. The "Day of Atonement" in ch.16 holds the two together.

Content:

- Sets out the rules for Israelite sacrifices and shows why they were needed
- Gives rules for social personal behaviour
- Describes rituals covering everyday needs
- Stresses the holiness of God and his people

For Today:

- God is holy, so we are also to be holy
- Worship is to be offered with care and reverence
- God wants to hallow ordinary things
- God has provided a means to restore our broken relationship with him

On Sunday 3rd April, our valued organist Trevor Farrer will be retiring from his role as senior organist at St. Paul's church. Trevor has been an excellent colleague with whom to work; he is unfailing in good humour and has dedicated himself to serving St. Paul's faithfully in this way for many years. He says he is retiring, but we may still see him from time to time at the console. However, a well-earned retirement from this ministry beckons and we wish Trevor every blessing as we give thanks for his commitment and service these years past. Thank you Trevor.

Alphege of Canterbury

On 19th April the Church of England celebrates the memory of Alphege, described in the Calendar of *Common Worship* as 'Archbishop of Canterbury, Martyr, 1012'. His death was at the hands of the invading Danes, by whom he had been taken prisoner. Not long after the Norman Conquest Archbishop Lanfranc (a Norman appointee) questioned whether Alphege had actually been a martyr, that is, someone who had suffered death for the faith, though he did not question Alphege's piety and standing as Archbishop. The person with whom he had this conversation — the theologian and philosopher Anselm, who later succeeded Lanfranc as Archbishop — persuaded Lanfranc otherwise, the argument turning on the fact that, although the invading heathens wished to put him up for ransom, Alphege refused to make any payment to obtain his release and forbade anyone else to do so. According to the Anglo-Saxon Chronicle, the enraged the Danes had Alphege brought to their assembly at Greenwich, where some of the men, in a drunken stupor, 'pelted him with bones and with ox-heads, and one of them struck him on the head with the back of an axe, so that he sank down with the blow, and his holy blood fell on the ground, and thus he sent his holy soul to God's kingdom'.

Alphege was buried in St Paul's. But in 1023, by which time England was part of an Anglo - Danish empire ruled by King Cnut, the king authorised a public display of veneration for the Archbishop. And so his body was taken from St Paul's on 8th June, resting first at Southwark, and then at Rochester, before reaching Canterbury on 15th June, where he was reburied. There he was revered as a symbol of resistance to the Danes, in admirable contrast to the ineffectual King Ethelred, who had heavily taxed the country in order to pay the Danes to go away — though they repeatedly came back for more! King Cnut may have been astute in moving the focal point of Alphege's potentially hostile cult away from London; but the decision to honour him publicly could be seen as a gesture of reconciliation towards his Anglo-Saxon subjects. Alphege's cult flourished but was eclipsed in the twelfth century by that of Thomas Becket (?1118-1170), for which Canterbury became famous throughout Western Christendom.

Alphege, or more properly Ælfheah — for that was his Anglo-Saxon name, Alphege being a Norman version of it — was recognised while he was still alive as a learned and holy man, and a noteworthy leader of the church. He began his ecclesiastical career as a monk at Deerhurst near Tewkesbury; he then went to Bath in the early 960s, at a time when a great reform of monastic life and learning was taken place in England, and there he soon became Abbot. He was appointed Bishop of Winchester (the capital of England at the time) in 984 as a worthy successor to the greatest of the reformers, Bishop Æthelwold; and after working there to promote Æthelwold's favoured cult of St Swithin, completing a massive extension of the cathedral, and continuing to foster the scholarship for which Winchester had become renowned, he became Archbishop of Canterbury in 1006. Archbishops (and Bishops) had major roles in society at large, not just in the church; and in Canterbury he would have been required to take a lead in resisting the renewed Danish invasions. It was their siege of Canterbury in September 1011 that led to Ælfheah's capture and his death the following year.

God for All, All for God

The Archdeacon of Westmorland and Furness, the Ven. Penny Driver, writes about our diocesan strategy of "God for All"

The real challenge of the "God for All" plans and strategy is that it means everyone doing their bit. It means - All for God!

If you are a member of a church in Cumbria (and a bit of North Yorkshire) we are asking you to play your part in helping more people connect with God and grow in your own faith through your care and service, worship and witness.

As I travel around the Southern archdeaconry the response to God for All is varied. Some say "Why should we bother?" Others suggest they are not equipped to do what we are asking of them. I overheard one gentleman say "not likely, this church will see me out just as it is."

And yet we know in our hearts that falling numbers of worshippers and clergy, and more pressure on our finances is simply pointing us to the fact that we have not got the church we need for our task which is set out in the great commission at the end of Matthew's gospel.

"Therefore go and make disciples of all nations, baptising them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit." (Matthew 28:19)

This is not as difficult as it seems and there is quite a lot happening already. I meet many groups of Christians from different churches serving their communities through foodbanks, credit unions, coffee drop-in centres, playgroups and lunches for the elderly.

I meet other groups who have joined together to share Bible stories with children through Open the Book sessions in schools and Messy Church. There are study groups meeting in pubs, difficult questions websites and men's breakfasts.

I meet church communities who are encouraging, training and authorising ordinary members of congregations to help with the leading of worship and pastoral visiting.

I find church communities asking the questions 'What can we do better together? How do we share our resources and so become more effective?' I meet many, especially in the tourist areas, looking at their buildings critically thinking how they might make them fit for purpose and help buildings tell the story of our faith by their welcome, their hospitality and by the way they offer Holy space to those who visit this beautiful part of our country.

There is so much already but we just need more! We need a critical mass in order to turn the tide; we need all of us to move from our complacency of the past where we found ourselves dwelling on "God for us and with our own vicar" and move now to "God for all and by us all".

God is calling for change. God is calling for us to work for unity. And God has a purpose for us and for his church today. If you have a faith in God, a love for Jesus and you love your church, please discover how you might be involved, and even if you are not sure what you believe, get involved anyway; it might help you discover more of God for yourself.

All Saints' Underbarrow Church Reordering

Following the consultations held in Underbarrow last summer, the PCC of Underbarrow with Helsington agreed to seek approval for a faculty from the Diocese to progress with the reordering. We included within the plans the work identified to the rooves and gutters and other maintenance items identified by the Ouinquennial inspection. This increased the expected total costs to between £110,000 and £120,000. Approval was received in December 2015. The PCC agreed to allocate £20,000 out of its reserves to this project, and the Helsington-based members of the PCC offered an additional £6,500 from its reserves which had arisen from the sale of the Sunday School many years ago. Members of the PCC were invited to consider how much they might be able to donate to this project over the next 3 years, which raised about £40,000. Therefore, the PCC agreed that the total of £65,000 was sufficient to make a start on the works, and the priority was determined to be replacing the heating and lighting. We will go out to tender shortly for this element of the works, with a view to commencing the onsite works in May, after the next wedding on May 7th. The PCC agreed that any services while the works are ongoing would be held at St John's Helsington, to allow the works to be carried out most efficiently. We anticipate that the church will remain closed until the end of July, in preparation for Toby Cartwright and Charlotte O'Loughlin's wedding on 20th August. We are delighted that we have reached the stage where our plans for the improvements to the church are beginning to come to fruition. We have made an excellent start to raising the required financial resources, but more will need to be done. We will shortly be giving the opportunity to other church members and parishioners to consider if they would like to contribute financially, and exploring the opportunity to apply for grants to allow the total scheme to be undertaken. I hope that you will not be inconvenienced too much by the church being closed while these works are progressing, and that you will welcome the improved facilities.



Make sure you can vote in the Referendum!

Whatever your views on the European Union, you will only be able to vote in the forthcoming Referendum if you are on the electoral register.

Don't assume you are registered just because you pay Council Tax!

The registration system changed two years ago. Previously, one person in every household was responsible for registering everyone else who lived at that address. Under the 'Individual Electoral Registration' system, each person is now required to register to vote individually, rather than by household. If you don't have a letter from the District Council showing that you are registered to vote, then take action now – it's easy to do.

were told that it was able to press 'entry' buttons, shut drawers, and attract attention when help was needed. It was very moving to see the dedication of the animal to caring for its disabled owner.
