A LETTER FROM DIANE GILMORE



Hello, my name is Diane Gilmore. I am a second year SSM curate based at STK and licensed to the Two Valleys Mission Community and I live in Staveley. My paid role is as the Anglican Chaplain at HMP Lancaster Farms. My call to ministry grew unexpectedly out of 15 years volunteering in prisons, and my curacy integrates both chaplaincy and parish experience.

Each October, **Prison Week** invites us to pause, reflect, and pray for all affected by crime and punishment—victims, those in prison, their families, staff, and society. As a chaplain, I walk alongside people in a place most never see, yet which deeply shapes lives.

Prison is often misunderstood, its image shaped by television: slamming doors, harsh voices, long corridors. The reality can indeed be harsh, but also deeply human. Every day as I pass through the gates, I see that prison is more than punishment—it is a community where despair and hope meet and where lives balance between past mistakes and future possibilities.

My role is not to judge, but to be present for people of all faiths and none. Sometimes that means sitting with someone who has just received devastating news, chatting to a man on the wing or sharing a cup of coffee with my congregation after the Sunday service.

One of the most powerful parts of chaplaincy is the "ministry of presence"—being there, consistently, when someone needs to be seen and heard. In a place where trust is scarce, listening can be transformative. I have witnessed men who arrived hardened and defensive gradually open up, realising there is one space where they can speak freely, without agenda.

Prison Week reminds us that these small moments matter. It calls us to pray for those who are afraid, lonely, guilty, or striving for a fresh start. It also invites prayer for prison officers, probation staff, healthcare workers and chaplains who have heavy responsibilities and are working in challenging environments.

Prison Week does not idealise prison or dismiss the pain caused by crime. Instead, it acknowledges the truth that every person is more than the worst thing they have done. As a chaplain, I see this lived out daily in small, hidden ways. As we mark Prison Week, I invite you to join me in prayer and reflection. Life behind the walls is complex and often painful, yet grace is present, and the light of hope—though flickering—still shines.

Cartmel Fell and District Local History Society

Unfortunately, family health meant Gill Jepson's Potted History of Barrow, our programmed talk for September, has had to be postponed but Stuart Newstead kindly brought forward his talk "From Poor House to Workhouse" an interesting run through the Poor Laws and conditions affecting Workhouses.

Kevin Grice's talk on 13th October at 2pm will be Brockhole 125: a pictorial history of a house and garden. Brockhole House, on the shore of Lake Windermere, was built for a wealthy silk merchant, William Gaddum. This Arts and Crafts villa was designed by Dan Gibson, with gardens created by Thomas Mawson. Kevin will tell the story of Brockhole House and trace its ownership through photographs from the Gaddum Archive to which he has been given unique access. Kevin is a retired barrister and part-time judge, who is now extensively involved with local history and archaeology in Cumbria.

The trip along the mine was not for everyone, being very realistic. Lunch was enjoyed at The Wensleydale Creamery before a cheese making demonstration and a history of the Creamery from humble beginnings was found to be most interesting. A cuppa-stop at Country Harvest on the way home, ended a very enjoyable day. 17 members turned out for our September meeting, Julie led us through business before we moved next door to where 6 tables were set ready for a Pasta making demonstration by our own Evelyn Cervetti and daughter Maria. 4 members rolled up their sleeves and washed their hands to 'Have a go'. It was entertaining watching the 4 learners get to grips with the technique. Pasta resting and tea was served and raffle drawn. Yvonne was the lucky winner of a pasta roller kindly donated by Pam. Maria judged a class of 10 'Small is beautiful' entries, Wendy, Beryl and Pam were the winners. The rolling process was explained and caused great amusement among the audience, but after many rolls and mopping of brows beautifully thin lasagne sheets and tagliatelle were produced, all ready for tomorrow's meals or the freezer. The next meeting will be an Open Meeting; Rob David will talk on Muncaster Castle's Wartime Secret: Protecting the Tate Gallery. Everyone will be made welcome for this presentation followed by homemade refreshments.

CROOK WI

This year we had no entries in the Westmorland County Show but several of our members helped behind the scenes with the chores of setting up, staging and stewarding. We had a very interesting talk from Peter Jones, an enthusiastic member of the Lancaster Canal Trust. He had an excellent presentation of slides with captions telling us about the history of the Lancaster Canal from its earliest days. In the early 1800's, before the arrival of railways, it was cheaper to transport goods such as coal and limestone by water.

Now parts of the northern section of the canal are dry or in-filled. There is much wildlife, flowers and butterflies to be enjoyed along the route of the canal and volunteers have already restored one section which is holding water once again. These volunteers also maintain the bridges and have upgraded the tow paths, making the canal a corridor of tranquility in our busy world and a lovely facility for everyone to enjoy.

CROSTHWAITE & LYTH WI

Crosthwaite and Lyth W.I. gathered in force in the Village Hall to enjoy a members' night and heard 8 members give fascinating family historical stories covering a rather wide variety of subjects. 5 of our members enjoyed a fun afternoon at Critter Creek Adventure Golf in Troutbeck Bridge for our September social afternoon. There were 3 holes-in-one and the eventual champion was quite fittingly, our President, Jean Sherratt.

UNDERBARROW WI

This month our meeting was a fascinating presentation by Andrew Leitch and Jim Bownass from Cumbria Film Archive, who worked in journalism and local TV. They were both interested in local history and have collected, restored, and added commentary (where needed) to many films about our area. We started with unique clips circa 1900 from Carlisle, Barrow and Whitehaven of royal visits, parades, and workers at factory gates. Young boys in particular were excited about the unusual experience of being filmed and grinned and waved their hats enthusiastically. We then moved on to our area, with films including 'Our Town - Kendal'- from the sixties, the visit in the fifties of the Queen and Prince Philip to Appleby, Ambleside and Kendal, and a report about transport which mentioned the coming of the motorway. Even decades ago, Kendal was known for its traffic problems-no surprise there. Overall, we learnt about employment and working conditions, farming, holiday making, how young professionals could rent a property for £5 a week, saw buildings that were still recognisable and others that had been demolished. WI members commented afterwards about how interesting it was, and we were left wanting to see more of this unique archive. Next month's meeting will be a gin tasting.

Members and friends enjoyed a trip to Kirkby Stephen and then on to Eggleston Hall gardens near Barnard Castle in place of our August meeting. It was very warm, and we were glad of the seats to sit on in the garden. Many members bought plants from the nursery.


